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Act 537 Sewage Facilities Plan Update

In 1966, the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act (Act 537) was enacted by Pennsylvania state legislature to address existing and future sewage disposal problems. To meet these objectives, the act requires proper planning of all types of sewage facilities, permitting of individual and community on-lot disposal systems, as well as, uniform standards for designing such systems. The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection requires municipalities to adopt and enforce Act 537 plans as well as update them as needed.

The Act 537 plan is the township's outlook on where public sewage facilities may be expanded or modified in the future. The principal factors which will shape the plan include pinpointing sections of the township with failing on-lot septic systems, locating potential sites of residential and commercial development, and the economic feasibility of infrastructure expansion. We also examine our current infrastructure to determine whether capital improvements are needed to process current and future demands.

The township is currently undergoing the process of updating our Act 537 Sewage Facilities Plan. Our current plan was last adopted in 1995. Since 1995, there have been special studies and amendments to the plan but the foundation of the plan is still the 1995 version. As many of you know, Warwick Township has changed dramatically over the past 21 years. This change translates to an increased need to have a current Act 537 plan in place.

The initial step of the process is to assess the current on-lot disposal systems in the township and determine if there are areas of the township which have a high frequency of failing systems. The township will be mailing a survey to those in Warwick with on-lot disposal systems this summer. If you have a septic system, please take the time to complete and return the survey to the township. Your input will assist us in creating a more accurate and useful Act 537 Sewage Facilities Plan that can provide critical assistance to you and your neighbors.

The Sleeping Room Door: Open or Closed?

The NFPA (National Fire Protection Association) Educational Messages Advisory Committee recognizes that many homes do not have NFPA's recommended smoke alarm coverage and some residents use alternative sleeping areas. As a result, the Committee critically examined the issues that impact educational messaging around this topic. Variables include:

- Will a closed door delay early warning from a smoke alarm located outside the sleeping room?
- Will a single station smoke alarm, installed in the sleeping room with the door closed, provide early warning to a fire outside the sleeping area to allow for safe escape?
- Does a closed sleeping room door impact the use of that door as the primary escape route out of the room?
- What is the impact of a closed door when the fire originates in the sleeping room and no smoke alarm is present in the room?
- About one-quarter of home fire deaths occur from fires that originate in sleeping rooms. How will a closed sleeping room door impact the rates of fatalities?
- Does closing the sleeping room door have the potential to increase risk of injury or death from fire?
- Does a closed sleeping room door have different implications for special populations such as those who have mobility, sensory, or cognitive disabilities?
- Will a closed sleeping room door reduce fatalities in homes if working smoke alarms are not present?

Based on these and other unanswered questions, the NFPA recommends additional research to examine these and other variables.

- A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire.
- Install smoke alarms in every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. For the best protection, make sure all smoke alarms are interconnected.

You are most vulnerable from a fire when you are asleep. If you have someone with special needs, children or older adults living in your home, the risks increase the longer it takes to detect smoke anywhere in your home. The earliest moment that smoke is detected provides the greatest amount of time to escape. The opposite is also true. You may have no time to escape if you don't have enough detectors and if they are not interconnected.

Smoke detectors are somewhat like a forecaster predicting a hurricane's arrival. When you know its coming you can make a plan. Without a warning you are in serious trouble and no time to safely react. With fire, you must always be prepared for the unexpected. Every fire incident that we see is unexpected. It can happen in any home.

"Wireless Interconnected Smoke Detectors" provide the opportunity to upgrade the smoke detectors in any home regardless of age.

REMINDER FOR PHASE 2 ON-LOT SEWAGE REGISTRATION 2016

In January 2016, the township sent letters to all households in phase 2 of the Warwick township on-lot sewage management program. These households are required to have their septic systems pumped by December 31, 2016. They must file a visual inspection form that is to be filled out by their waste hauler. In addition we need a copy of the bill from their hauler

Warwick township is requesting that anyone who is part of phase 2, have their system pumped and return their forms to us as soon as possible to avoid having to pay any fines in the future. If you have lost or misplaced your forms you can obtain a copy by going to our website: warwick-bucks.org (permits and forms) or you can pick them up at the township administration building.

In 2011, Warwick township adopted the on-lot sewage maintenance ordinance to ensure basic maintenance of on-lot septic systems in the township. Septic tanks must be pumped at intervals not to exceed three years. You only need to register for the program one time but you will be notified every three years in reference to pumping your tank. Pumping your tank regularly will greatly reduce the chance of accumulated solids escaping the tank and clogging other components especially the drainfield, which is the most critical component of most septic systems. In addition, pumping the tank regularly will prolong the life of any on-lot system.



WORKING FROM HOME

Are you working out of your home? If so, here is what you need to know. Warwick Township would like to remind residents that a zoning permit is required for all Home Occupations.

What is a "home occupation?"

A home occupation is an accessory use that is clearly subordinate to the existing residential use of

the property. There is a \$100 registration fee for a home occupation, as well as a \$50 annual renewal fee. Failure to receive a zoning permit for a home occupation could result in civil enforcement proceedings with fines up to \$500.00 per day, plus court and attorney fees, as determined by the district Justice.

What types of home occupations are there?

Home occupations in Warwick Township come in the following types:

- Professional Offices (salesperson, architect, engineer, doctor, lawyer, accountant, etc.)
- Personal Services (barber, beautician, photographer, etc.)
- Instructional Services (teaching maximum of four students at a time)
- Home Crafts (artist, sculptor, tailor, rug weaving, lapidary work, furniture making, etc.)
- Business Trades (electrician, plumber, landscaper, carpenter, mason, painter, roofer, etc.)
- Repair services (repair for small appliances, watches, bicycles, locks, etc. but NOT cars, trucks, snow mobiles, ATV's outboard motors, or jet skis)
- Family day care (supervising children not related to the caregiver)
- No-Impact Home Based Business (There are general standards that apply to all home occupations and then there are specific standards that apply to different types of home occupations.

What if I don't have any customers or clients come to visit me?

If no one other than family members is involved in the business, there is no display or sale of retail goods, there are no signs, the activity doesn't generate more sewage than a typical residence and the activity doesn't occupy more than 25% of the habitable area of the home, the business will probably be considered a "No-impact Home-Based Business." A permit is still required. With a proper permit, No-Impact Home-Based Businesses are allowed in all zoning districts.

Where can I have a home occupation?

A home occupation is either permitted by right, permitted by special exception, or not permitted depending on the type of home occupation and the zoning district where the property is located. "Permitted by right" means if the owner applies for a permit and meets all the regulations in the ordinance, they will be issued a permit. "Permitted by special exception" means the applicant has to apply to the Zoning Hearing Board for permission to operate that type of home occupation in that location. "Not permitted" means that a particular type of home occupation is not allowed in a particular district.

What are some of the general rules and regulations that apply to home occupations?

The home occupation must be carried on wholly indoors. The appearance of the home cannot be altered to cause it to be different from the surrounding homes. Home occupations cannot create noise, vibration, glare, fumes, odors, dust, or electrical interference.

Ways to Stay Green When the Leaves are Changing

Ideas for preparing for winter in an environmentally friendly way



Fall is the time of year when school starts back up and the leaves begin to fall. As you are working outside and enjoying the cooler weather, remember these tips to protect our environment and water.

Harvest fallen leaves

- There are many sources of stormwater pollution unique to autumn, and we need your help to control them. The leaves are falling, and their improper disposal poses a threat to our water resources. Leaf litter and any yard waste dumped into a stormwater basin or near a waterway can cause harmful nutrient accumulation. Leaves swept into the street can easily enter storm drains and make their way into the nearest creek as well.
- Dispose of leaf litter and yard waste in a compost pile and never in the street or stream! You can shred yard and leaf waste to use as mulch or fertilizer for your yard and garden.

Aerate and overseed your lawn

- Aerating your lawn is an important, yet commonly overlooked, lawn maintenance task. Aeration involves perforating the soil with small holes to allow air, water and nutrients to penetrate the grass roots. This helps the roots grow deeply and produce a stronger, more vigorous lawn. It also reduces soil compaction and restores your lawns natural draining ability resulting in less runoff to our streams.
- The practice of overseeding lawns is really nothing more than spreading grass seed over an existing lawn. Particular attention should be paid to bare areas. With fall germination, the young grass will have two or three months to become better established before temperatures drop too low and growth stops. Next spring, the young plants will have another few months to develop deeper roots before the summer heat sets in. A full, healthy lawn helps to prevent erosion and also reduces runoff.



A little extra caution while you keep up with your fall to-do list can make a big difference for the health of our environment, and we thank you for cooperating with this effort. To report an illicit discharge to the stormwater collection system, stream, creek or river, please call 215-343-6100.

York Road Update

The southbound reconstruction from Meyer Way to the south end of the project will be completed by approximately September of 2016. This includes drainage work, half of the concrete paving at Bristol intersection, bridge remediation and paving to binder level. The contractor's goal is to switch traffic to the northbound reconstruction in September and complete drainage, bridge remediation, the other half of the concrete paving at Bristol and paving to binder level by end of November. The contractor anticipates sidewalk, minor grading, permanent signals, and permanent signing to be completed through the winter. Final wearing paving and any other weather sensitive stabilization will happen in the spring/summer and be completed by end of Summer 2017.

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM KEVIN LAVERTY, PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR

Warwick Township is making winter storm management preparations for dedicated roads to assure the highest level of service to our residents. The following is our general snow and ice removal policy for the Township. The policy may be adjusted to address unique situations or state of emergency designations.

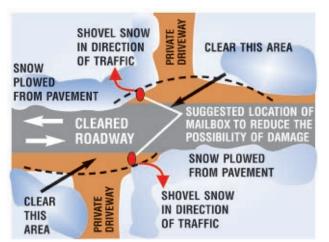
To serve you better, we need your cooperation with all facets of winter storm management. We ask you to review our policy and the additional information provided here. If you have any further questions, please email them to klaverty@Warwick-Township.org



The Township does not mobilize its snow removal forces for its plowing operations until a minimum of 3" of snow is on the ground. Icing conditions are addressed using different criteria. Designated snow emergency routes will be the first areas salted and plowed within the Township, followed by collector roads, main development streets, and cul-de-sacs. For the initial plowing sequence, drivers are instructed to make one pass in each direction on the street and one pass in and out of cul-de-sacs (up the middle). The priority of each vehicle is to open each street in its assigned area. At the start of each storm, trucks are loaded with salt and sent to their assigned areas, their instructions are to apply salt to all Snow Emergency Routes then collector and arterial roads, followed by main development roads then cul-de-sacs and dead ends last. So if we come through and have not been on your street it is because cul-de-sacs and dead ends are LAST. We will address you as soon as our primary roadways have been treated and are safe. Salt needs the movement of traffic to be most effective; so if it seems your street has not been salted, it may just be that there has not been enough traffic to promote melting

Snow is pushed where it is most convenient and maximizes our time. We do not purposely place snow on anyone's property. The snow is pushed to areas that maximize our time and effectiveness. We are working as hard and as quickly as possible to open up our roadways for all.





Here are ways for you to assist with the snow removal efforts:

Vehicle parking:

- Park off the roadway and in your driveway. On street parking inhibits our trucks from clearing the streets.
- If you live on a cul-de-sac, parking on the street makes snow removal almost impossible.
- If you live on a designated snow emergency route, you may not park on the street once a snow emergency has bee declared.

General Removal of Snow:

 Do not throw or blow the snow that you remove from your driveway or sidewalks back into the street. This slows the snow removal process and you could be subject to a fine.

Driveways:

- Wait until all plowing operations have ceased before attempting to clear your driveway.
- If you clear your driveway before plowing operations are completed, leave the last 6 feet unshoveled.

To review the ordinances on snow removal, visit www.warwick-bucks.org and click on ORDINANCES. The township ordinances are listed for your information.

Above all, please be patient. Snow plows push snow, they don't eat it! Our primary goal is to clear the streets for safe and accessible passage by all; we will move all snow to the curb line so YES your driveway will be plowed in, please review the drawing above to minimize your frustration and aggravation. AGAIN the roadway being cleared is our NUMBER 1 priority. Our employees need time to do their job properly. Please keep in mind that our employees also require rest breaks to insure everyone's safety. We do our very best to insure timely operations but we do have 60 lane miles of roadway to address with a small crew.

Be aware that your mailbox is in the Township right-of-way and may be subjected to tremendous weight of thrown or piled snow. The Township is not responsible for mailboxes damaged by thrown snow, so to minimize this type of damage, check to see that your mailbox, the post, and the box mounting are in good condition and do not extend into the street.

If there is an immediate or urgent problem, you can contact the Township and leave your contact information, address, and the nature of your problem. The Public Works Department will respond in a timely and efficient manner to rectify the situation. If there is an emergency problem for the police or fire company, dial 9-1-1.

We appreciate your review of this information. The Township strives to provide a high level of service, while minimizing the use of tax dollars.

Where To Turn For Help With Drug and Alcohol Issues In Bucks County

This informational sheet will help you or your family member access treatment for a drug and/or alcohol problem, as well as give some other resource information. The first step in accessing treatment is for the individual to get a professional assessment to determine the extent of the problem and the type of treatment and recovery plan needed. Adult and adolescent services are available throughout Bucks County. For more information, please call our Approval of Care Department at 215-773-9643.

To access treatment for those who have private health insurance, call the number on the back of the insurance card listed under Mental Health/Substance Abuse.

To access treatment for those with Medical Assistance, call Magellan Health Services at 877-769-9784 and they will give information to the nearest treatment agency for an assessment.

To access information regarding Veteran's Benefits, call 877-222-8387 to find out eligibility for services. Individuals who are Veterans are eligible for county funding.

For individuals with no insurance, there may be county funded treatment available as well as other supportive services. The individual must go to one of the assessment sites listed below, either as a walk in or calling for an appointment. The individual will need to bring certain documents to the assessment, including proof of Bucks County residency, and other documents to complete a Medical Assistance application. Due to limited funding, County funding for residential treatment is budgeted on a monthly basis, which limits the number of individuals who can be admitted into that level of care each month. However, other treatment alternatives, such as outpatient treatment, are available. Pregnant and/or injection drug users and those being referred by an emergency room following an overdose are given preference for funding.

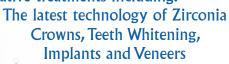

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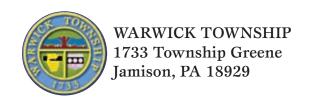
