## From the Board of Supervisors . . .



We frequently receive the question "How can I volunteer in my community?" While there are numerous ways to do so, there is one need that overshadows many of the others. Pennsylvania has experienced a dramatic reduction in local fire company volunteers. Sadly, no community is unaffected by lower volunteerism. In the 1970's, there were 300,000 fire company volunteers in Pennsylvania. The number of volunteers is now under 50,000. Your local firefighters are the first responders when you need help. Their duties range from house fires and vehicle accidents to alarm response and fire safety training.

Warwick Township, proudly served by the Warwick Fire Company, is no exception to these statistics. While a strong membership persists, there is a growing need for new, lively and active volunteers. Volunteers can come in all shapes and sizes. For those less adventurous, there are many positions in the fire company other than emergency

responders. Volunteers with all types of backgrounds and careers, ranging from carpenters and business owners to accountants and engineers, can make meaningful contributions to the fire company. Even younger Warwick residents (14 and up) can volunteer as junior firefighters. Also, there is no minimum amount of volunteering time to join, you can give time when you have it.

Volunteering for the Warwick Fire Company can award you with not only the thrill of riding on the back of a fire engine, but also with a sense of community while working alongside your neighbors to create a safer place for all of us to live, work and play.

## Why test smoke detectors?

Smoke detectors have the following functions:

- 1. Their ability to sense smoke.
- 2. Their electronic ability to relay the sensing to the horn.
- 3. The ability for the horn to make noise.

Should anyone of these functions fail, the detector fails. Pushing the test button only tests item #3 (the power supply). A full test of the smoke detectors requires smoke. Artificial smoke is sold in an aerosol can for this purpose. Cooking smoke provides a great test.

If your smoke detectors are connected by wires (hardwired) or are wireless they have these functions:

- 1. The ability to sense smoke.
- 2. The electronic ability to relay the sensing to the horn within the sensing detector.
- 3. The ability to also send the signal to the other detectors.
- 4. The receiving detector's ability to receive the signal electronically.
- 5. And the ability of the receiving detector to make noise.

Every detector must be checked with smoke to insure all of these functions occur. If one function fails, the detector fails.

Detectors 10 years old or older have an increasing failure

rate. The older they are, the more frequently they need to be tested. Monthly testing is recommended. Assuming that all detectors are the same age, when one fails they should all be replaced.

If your detectors are not connected either hardwired or wirelessly, you may not hear the detector. For example: your garage or basement detector can't be heard from your bedroom.

If you have rooms without detectors, you won't know there is smoke or fire until the smoke can penetrate the door and reach a detector. This scenario allows the fire to go undetected and is the fundamental reason people die in a fire. A detector in every room with a door is recommended. The current Fire Code requires a detector in each bedroom, on each level, basement and garage. Wireless interconnected detectors are easy to add to any home that doesn't have interconnected smoke detectors. They are a true safety investment that can save your life.

Wireless interconnected smoke detectors can be purchased with batteries that require annual changing or with 10-year batteries. Either way, "your home is not protected if your detectors are not connected".

## Help Keep Pollution Out of Storm Drains

Only rain in the drain! That's because storm drains and roadside ditches lead directly to our streams, creeks, lakes and rivers. So, any oil, pet waste, leaves, trash, or polluted water from washing your car or discharging your pool that enters a storm drain gets into our streams, creeks, lakes and rivers.

## What can you do?

Simple. These tips will help prevent pollutants from entering our streams, creeks, lakes and rivers:

- Use a broom instead of a hose to clean off your sidewalks and driveway.
- Sweep fertilizer off driveways and sidewalks, back onto your lawn.
- Keep leaves, grass clippings, trash, and fertilizers out of storm drains.
- Do not dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain.

#### Pool/Hot Tub/Spa Maintenance

- Servicing of a pool, hot tub, or spa often involves discharging all or a portion of the water or backwash water from filters, both of which may contain residual chlorine at levels that could be damaging to the environment.
   Pool, hot tub, and spa water shall not be directly or indirectly discharged to waters of the commonwealth, including storm sewers.
- Pool, hot tub and spa water may be discharged under the Pennsylvania Department
  of Environmental Protection guidelines which can be found at www.dep.pa.gov or
  can be provided by the Township.

## Keep our water clean!

## Tree Trimming in the Right-of-Way

## **Public Works Department**



It is the responsibility of the homeowner to trim their trees when branches hang in the right-of-way. Please trim any branches and vegetation that may have overgrown and which may impair the use or maintenance of a public road, trail, sidewalk or street. Many residents have reported difficulty walking along sidewalks in the township because of low hanging branches. Passing cars and trucks should not be struck by tree limbs. Our snow removal teams and maintenance crews with their oversized equipment need a minimum of 14-foot clearance. The Public Works Department is actively clearing overgrown vegetation from the right-of-way, signage and sight triangles.

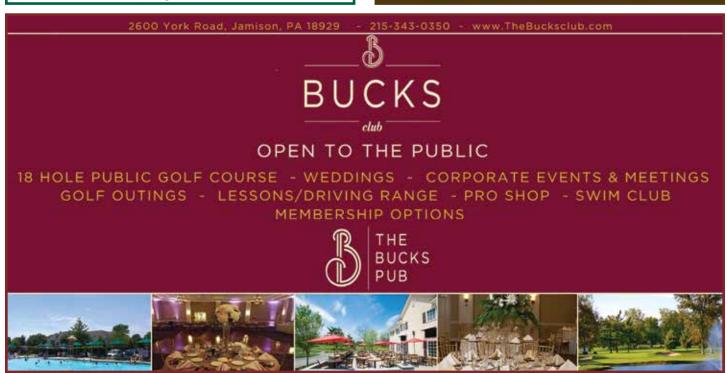

In June of 2017, Central Bucks Emergency Medical Services officially started providing emergency medical services to the township of Warwick, Warminster and borough of Ivyland. We immediately established a subscription drive and, due to the timing, it is running annually from June 1st till the following May 31st.

Annual subscription drive participation can assist you with ambulance bills after using 911. To learn more about the annual subscription drive, please visit our website. As a subscriber, if you call 911 in our area and your ambulance bill is only covered partially by your insurance, then you will not be responsible for the balance. One thing we do ask of subscribers from time to time is if your carrier under pays the bill that you contact them and have them reprocess it as an emergency so that a more realistic payment can be received. If you have a high deductible or no insurance coverage at all then your balance will be reduced by 50%. If you do not have a subscription you can call us or print a form from our website. The subscription is mailed out annually in October followed by a reminder in January.

We are only able to provide such services through continued community support. We strive to serve you in ways beyond responding to emergency 911 calls and appreciate your continued support and donations.

## **PLAYGROUND SAFETY**

A quick checklist for parents

Place this list in a prominent area of your home for quick reference. Then, before your children head out the door for the playground, check that:

## ☐ Supervision is present, but strings and ropes aren't.

Adult presence is needed to watch for potential hazards, observe, intercede and facilitate play when necessary. Strings on clothing or ropes used for play can cause accidental strangulation if caught on equipment.

## ☐ All children play on age-appropriate equipment.

Preschoolers, ages 2-5, and children ages 5-12, are developmentally different and need different equipment located in separate areas to keep the playground safe and fun for all.

#### ☐ Falls to surface are cushioned.

Nearly 70 percent of all playground injuries are related to falls to the surface. Acceptable surfaces include hardwood fiber/mulch, pea gravel, sand and synthetic materials such as poured-in-place, rubber mats or tiles. Playgrounds surfaces should not be concrete, asphalt, grass, blacktop, packed dirt or rocks.



## ☐ Equipment is safe.

Check to make sure the equipment is anchored safely in the ground, all equipment pieces are in good working order, S-hooks are entirely closed, bolts are not protruding, there are no exposed footings, etc.

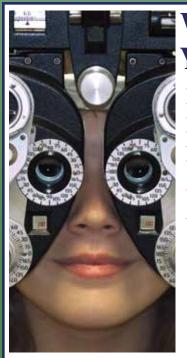

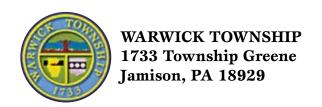
