From the Board of Supervisors...



As we welcome in 2018, we are hopeful that this year brings to you, our residents and business owners, good health and prosperity. As your elected officials we thank you for your continued support and hear your concerns. One request which we will immediately address is returning to a quarterly Township newsletter. While many of you like the new format, some want news more frequently. Don't forget to subscribe to our Township email by emailing your request to ctopley@warwick-township. org. The Township is also on Facebook, Twitter, and has a website which both provides news and provides an easy way to voice your concerns, questions, etc. The website is www.warwick-bucks.org.

Requests for information and concerns

We frequently receive requests for information that is readily available on our website (www.warwick-bucks.org) and updates occur frequently on our Facebook page and Twitter handle. If you need to report a problem, have a question, or need another service from the Township, use the "Contact Us" page on the website. Note that our staff is adept at handling most local government problems and typically responds within 48 hours, frequently within the same day. If there is something you want to discuss with an elected official, note that in your request and you'll be contacted within a few days. For any specific requests for information, you will find a Right to Know (RTK) form on the website. These are typically filled well under the five days allowed by State mandate.

Real Estate Taxes

For the eighth consecutive year, your local real estate tax will not be increased. Local tax is 10% of your tax bill. In addition, we have not incurred any additional debt since the open space program was in effect before the 2008 economic downturn. While we have added an EMS building and service, repaired a record number of roads, and are continuing to make infrastructure upgrades, our goal is to hold taxes as long as possible.

Roadway Improvements

For 2018, we have a number of projects planned to benefit the Warwick community. Our road program will include base repair, edge mill and overlay of the following roads:

- CREEK ROAD (Mearns Road to bend @ pump house)
- CANDY TUFT DRIVE
- KATYDID COURT
- STONY ROAD (Meyer Way to Turkey Trot Road)
- GUINEA LANE (Cedar Drive to Almshouse Road)
- And a tar and chip application on **GRAEME WAY** and **HART LANE**

Other major projects

The largest financial project for 2018 is lending the Warwick Fire Company (WFC) the balance of their \$1.65 million dollar construction loan formerly held with a local bank. Although there is a real cost of providing WFC repayment terms of 30 years at 0 percent interest, we recognize the importance of retaining an asset and service vital to you.

Our newest park, Memorial Park, broke ground in 2017 with trails, roadway, and parking areas being installed. In 2018, we are proud to announce that Warwick Township is the recipient of a \$250,000 DCNR matching grant which will allow us to add a pavilion, play area, memorial tiles, and a safety town. We have already been awarded a non-matching \$500,000 grant to connect the new Memorial Park with the historic Moland House by going under route 263. This work will be done in 2018 per the requirements of the grant.

Finally, we usher in this New Year with a change in Township Manager. Our long time Manager, Gail Weniger, has retired. She worked with us carefully and diligently on a succession plan, the result of which you will read about in the 'Meet the New Manager' in this newsletter. We had the good fortune of promoting from within in 2002 when Gail became manager and we are now looking forward to many good years with Kyle.





Seven (7) By Ed Pfeiffer, Fire Marshal

Some people know seven as a Lucky number. Seven also has a sad side. Every day, on average, seven people die from a fire in their home in the United States. In some cases, they were unprepared for the unexpected. Have you considered the possibility of a fire in your home? Do you have an escape plan? Do you have an interconnected smoke detector in every room with a door? Every home has some potential for a fire.

National fire statistics show that the very young and those 55 and older are the most vulnerable in a fire. In addition to temporary poor memory caused by the carbon monoxide in smoke, hearing loss (don't sleep with hearing aids) and mobility are serious factors affecting escape.

If your home has a complete and operational interconnected smoke alarm system, your home is significantly safer than without. Our homes that have a sprinkler system also have an interconnected smoke detector system. Together, they provide the most fire safe home.

Older homes that were built without a complete interconnected smoke alarm system or no interconnected detectors (built prior to the 1970s) and have never been upgraded are the least fire safe. I would like the

opportunity to visit your homes and help to plan your upgrade. I can suggest the type of

smoke detectors to purchase, where to put them and will gladly assist anyone who needs help with their installation. Call at 215-343-6100 or e-mail me at epfeiffer@ warwick-township.org.

California has experienced several devastating wildland/forest fires that burned out entire communities. Here in Warwick we are seeing more homes being built in a "wooded" setting. On occasion we

have also experienced high winds and extremely dry conditions. Homeowners who live in these areas must be diligent about clearing brush from around their house (under decks), extra careful when putting out fire place ashes, any type of outdoor cooking, etc.

Some of our homes in the woods lack easy fire department access. In some cases, no one can evacuate using their car once fire equipment arrives. It will be a challenge for the fire department not to get too far into a confining position. Two good rules: don't park on top of leaves and keep a garden hose available. HAPPY 2018 FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR


County Township Real Estate Tax bills are mailed March 1st. Central Bucks School Real Estate Tax bills are mailed July 1st. If you have a new home or have had an assessment change you will receive a notice from the Bucks County Board of Assessment. Interim bills will then be mailed. They are issued every other month.

If you do not receive a real estate tax bill in March or July please call the Tax Office at 215-491-0611 or e-mail Warwicktaxbetts@aol.com Please notify the tax office of any address changes.

The last date to apply for the homestead reduction is March 1st.

Warwick Township receives \$750,000 in grants in 2017!



With the support of the Board of Supervisors, Warwick Township received two grants in 2017 totaling \$750,000.

The first grant is a non-matching federal grant in the amount of \$500,000 from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation through their Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP). The TAP provides funding for programs and projects defined as transportation alternatives, including on- and off-road pedestrian and bicycle facilities, infrastructure projects for improving non-driver access to public transportation and enhanced mobility, community improvement activities, and environmental mitigation, trails that serve a transportation purpose, and safe routes to school projects. This grant will allow the Township to construct a multi-use walking trail and bridge that will connect the western portion of Warwick with the eastern portion of Warwick without having to cross

York Road. This trail, called "Headquarters Trail" will start at the Moland House and go under York Road and will connect to the new park, Memorial Park, on the other side of York Road. It is the goal of the Township to have construction starting in 2019.

The second grant is a matching state grant in the amount of \$250,000 from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. The grants are administered by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Community Conservation Partnerships Program. Funding comes from the Keystone Fund, which is generated from a portion of the realty transfer tax; the Environmental Stewardship Fund; the ATV/Snowmobile Fund generated through fees for licenses; and federal monies. This grant will allow the Township to complete Memorial Park. Projects to be included in the completion of the park include a memorial plaza, pavilion with bathrooms, playground, Safety Town and site amenities. The park will have over 1.5 miles of multi-use trails and will remain a very passive, natural park. It is the Township's goal to complete the park in 2018 so it can be opened to the public.



Spring Yard Care Tips to Help Prevent Stormwater Pollution



Plant a large stature tree


• Large trees are great stormwater control. They can intercept over 1,000 gallons of rainwater each year. Where possible, plant a large broad-leaf tree such as an oak, maple, or black gum.


Consider planting natural, warm season grasses

• Native warm season grasses have extensive roots of 3 to 7 feet deep that enrich the soil and absorb many times the amount of rainwater that turf grass does. The grasses also help to filter out harmful nutrients which degrade our streams.

Get your soil tested before fertilizing

Avoid applying too much fertilizer. Purchase a soil test kit from your local Penn State
extension and submit soil samples from your lawn to determine the nutrients that
may be lacking. Visit www.aasl.psu.edu for more information.





 Spare your stream by avoiding spring fertilization and leave your grass clippings on your lawn instead. Grass clippings supply between 25% and 50% of nitrogen and phosphorus needs.

To report an illicit discharge to the stormwater collection system, stream, creek or river, please call the Township at 215-343-6100.



WORKING FROM HOME

Are you working out of your home? If so, here is what you need to know. Warwick Township would like to remind residents that a zoning permit is required for all Home Occupations.

What is a "home occupation?"

A home occupation is an accessory use that is clearly subordinate to the existing residential use of the property. There is a \$100 registration fee for a home occupation, as well as a \$50 annual renewal fee. Failure to register a home occupation could result in a civil fine with penalties up to and including \$500 per day plus court fees as determined by the District Justice.

What types of home occupations are there?

Home occupations in Warwick Township come in the following types:

- Professional Offices (salesperson, architect, engineer, doctor, lawyer, accountant, etc.)
- Personal Services (barber, beautician, photographer, etc.)
- Instructional Services (teaching maximum of four students at a time)
- Home Crafts (artist, sculptor, tailor, rug weaving, lapidary work, furniture making, etc.)
- Business Trades (electrician, plumber, landscaper, carpenter, mason, painter, roofer, etc.)
- Repair services (repair for small appliances, watches, bicycles, locks, etc. but NOT cars, trucks, snow mobiles, ATV's outboard motors, or jetskis)
- Family day care (supervising children not related to the caregiver)
- No-Impact Home Based Business (There are general standards that apply to all home occupations and then there are specific standards that apply to different types of home occupations.)

What if I don't have any customers or clients come to visit me?

If no one other than family members is involved in

the business, there is no display or sale of retail goods,

there are no signs, the activity doesn't generate more sewage than a typical residence and the activity doesn't occupy more than 25% of the labels area of the home, the business

habitable area of the home, the business will probably be considered a "No-Impact Home-Based Business." A permit is still required. With a proper permit, No-Impact Home-Based Businesses are allowed in all zoning districts.

Where can I have a home occupation?

A home occupation is either permitted by right, permitted by special exception, or not permitted depending on the type of home occupation and the zoning district where the property of located. "Permitted by right" means that if the owner applies for a permit and meets all the regulations in the ordinance, they will be issued a permit. "Permitted by special exception" means the applicant has to apply to the Zoning Hearing Board for permission to operate that type of home occupation in that location. "Not permitted" means that a particular type of home occupation is not allowed in a particular district.

What are some of the general rules and regulations that apply to home occupations?

The home occupation must be carried on wholly indoors. The appearance of the home cannot be altered to cause it to be different from the surrounding homes. Home occupations cannot create noise, vibration, glare, fumes, odors, dust, or electrical interference.

REMINDER FOR PHASE 1 ON-LOT SEWAGE REGISTRATION

In January 2018, the Township sent letters to all households in **phase 1** of the Warwick Township on-lot sewage management program. These households are required to have their septic systems pumped by December 31, 2018. They must file a visual inspection form that is to be filled out by their waste hauler. In addition, we need a copy of the bill from their hauler.

Warwick Township is requesting that anyone who is part of phase 1, have their system pumped and return their forms to us as soon as possible to avoid having to pay any fines in the future. If you have lost or misplaced your forms, you can obtain a copy by going to our website, warwick-bucks.org (permits and forms) or you can pick them up at the Township administration building.

In 2011, Warwick Township adopted the on-lot sewage maintenance ordinance to ensure basic maintenance of on-lot septic systems in the Township. Septic tanks must be pumped at intervals not to exceed three years. You only need to register for the program one time but you will be notified every three years in reference to pumping your tank. Pumping your tank regularly will greatly reduce the chance of accumulated solids escaping the tank and clogging other components especially the drainfield, which is the most critical component of most septic systems. In addition, pumping the tank regularly will prolong the life of any on-lot system.

New Newsletter Editions





PLAYGROUND SAFETY

A quick checklist for parents

Place this list in a prominent area of your home for quick reference. Then, before your children head out the door for the playground, check that:

☐ Supervision is present, but strings and ropes aren't.

Adult presence is needed to watch for potential hazards, observe, intercede and facilitate play when necessary. Strings on clothing or ropes used for play can cause accidental strangulation if caught on equipment.

☐ All children play on age-appropriate equipment.

Preschoolers, ages 2-5, and children ages 5 -1 2, are developmentally different and need different equipment located in separate areas to keep the playground safe and fun for all.

☐ Falls to surface are cushioned.

Nearly 70 percent of all playground injuries are related to falls to the surface. Acceptable surfaces include hardwood fiber/mulch, pea gravel, sand and synthetic materials such as poured-in-place, rubber mats or tiles. Playgrounds surfaces should not be concrete, asphalt, grass, blacktop, packed dirt or rocks.

☐ Equipment is safe.

Check to make sure the equipment is anchored safely in the ground, all equipment pieces are in good working order, S-hooks are entirely closed, bolts are not protruding, there are no exposed footings, etc.

Groundwater or storm water is water from rain and snow, which seeps into the soil. When soil becomes saturated, ground water seeps into basements. Sump pumps commonly are used to remove this water.

Sump pumps must **not** be connected to sanitary sewers, but rather must be connected to a storm sewer or discharge onto lawns.

WHY?

First, when sump pumps discharge into sanitary sewers, flooding often is

the result. Sanitary sewers are not designed to handle the extra volume sump pumps add. This extra volume wreaks havoc with homes, businesses, roads, and the sanitary sewer system.

Second, wastewater needs to be treated. Groundwater from sump pumps does not. The cost of treatment is high. When the volume of wastewater is increased by the addition of groundwater from sump pumps, the Authority's and ultimately the home and business owners' treatment costs increase significantly and unnecessarily.

Third, keeping ground water in the Township is important. Discharging groundwater onto lawns or in to the storm sewers is an ecologically sound practice. It helps stabilize the water table.

Fourth, keeping the water in the Township helps the Authority contain the costs for residents and businesses alike.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY SUMP PUMP IS CONNECTED TO THE SANITARY SEWER?

Reroute the pipe so that it discharges onto your lawn or into a nearby storm sewer. If you have questions, or need assistance or advice about how to bring your sump pumps into compliance with the law, contact the Municipal Authority, 215-343-3584.



IF I ASK FOR HELP, WILL I BE SUBJECT TO THE FINE?

No, so long as you take immediate steps to disconnect your sump pump from the sanitary sewer. Those who call and file a plan of action will be granted a fine-free grace period in which to comply.

HOW DOES THE AUTHORITY KNOW THAT SUMP PUMPS ARE DISCHARGED INTO THE SANITARY SEWER?

Remote cameras are routinely used as part of a preventive maintenance program. They record clear water flowing into the system from individual homes, businesses and leaking pipes in problem areas.

IS STORM WATER ENTERING SANITARY SEWERS A NEW PROBLEM?

No, but changing regulations by both the National and State Environmental Protection Agencies now prohibit wastewater treatment plants from handling storm water. These regulations significantly increase treatment costs.

ARE WE THE ONLY TOWNSHIP HAVING THIS PROBLEM?

No. Every township in the State is dealing with the same issues.


