# Looking forward - 2017

or any Manager, the Township budget can be one of the more challenging administrative duties. In addition to the elected officials and taxpayers, there are a variety of governmental regulations and requirements that impact the bottom line, usually negatively. Despite these challenges, we are happy to report that for the seventh consecutive year, there will be no local government real estate tax increase in Warwick Township.

Major projects for 2017 include the most ambitious roadway improvement program in recent history. Roads which are scheduled to be included for repair and maintenance include:

- Deer Run Drive (Route 263 to Doe Court)
- Fallow Hill Lane (Deer Run to Mill Road)
- Meyer Way (Stony to Land Road)
- Eddowes Road (Meetinghouse to Old York Road)
- Mulberry Lane
- Robinwood Drive
- Hampton Chase: E. Rockspray, Primrose, Oleander, North and South Daisey, Wisteria, Ironwood, Thyme, Arrowhead, Dogwoood (to East Rockspray walking path)
- Colony Road, Park Drive, Meadowview, and Wayne Drive
- Hidden Pond: Long Pond (Valley View to Bristol Road), Rosewood & Persimmon Lanes, Valley View, Hedgewood, and Chelsea
   \*including all of these roads anticipates a favorable bid

Estimated cost of the 2017 road program is \$1,105,000. Expect some inconvenience as we improve your roadways for the future.

# Looking forward ... continued from cover

Not in the Township budget, but certainly of interest to the public is the completion of the Route 263 project, which will be done in the 2017 calendar year. In addition, we have a DEP waterline project on Creek Road that will be completed in Spring 2017.

Other plans for 2017 include improving staffing in the police department and planning and zoning. We are now at 70-80% staffing of 2007. We are building up our staffing to assure that the community's needs for service are met.

Parks and Recreation capital projects will include revitalization of the two pavilions at Community Park, replacement of the fitness equipment in Community Park, and adding a pedestrian bridge to the new trail which traverses the newly acquired Memorial Park. This bridge will allow us to connect the Historic Moland House property with Memorial Park. Memorial Park, which is still to be completed, is the subject of a grant application for 2017. The plans for this park include a playground for children, a pavilion, bathrooms, and a large open field for the public to enjoy. The park is largely passive and the trails are set among a beautiful partially wooded terrain which is adjacent to the Neshaminy Creek. If the grant application is successful, the project will be undertaken in 2018.

## **EMERGENCY SERVICES**

The Township added its first permanent EMS station in 2016 and leased the service to Warminster Volunteer Ambulance Corps. We utilize \$5,000/year to assist with costs to this organization. For fire service, we are fortunate enough to be serviced by two companies – Warwick Fire Company and Hartsville Fire Company. The Fire services are ALL VOLUNTEER and they receive tax dollars from Warwick for their operations (94% Warwick and 6% Hartsville). However, the capital costs for the new building (WFC) and equipment costs rely heavily on donations. We ask every homeowner and business owner to contribute generously to keep



our Fire service ALL VOLUNTEER. More details about our emergency services can be found in our feature articles in this edition.

## REMINDER

## PHASE 3 ON-LOT SEWAGE VISUAL INSPECTION FORMS FOR 2017

In January 2017, the Township sent letters to all households in Phase 3 of the Warwick Township on-lot sewage management program. These households are required to have their on-lot sewage system pumped by December 31, 2017. They must file a visual inspection form that is to be filled out by their waste hauler. **WE ALSO NEED A COPY OF THE RECEIPT FROM THEIR HAULER.** 

Warwick Township is requesting that anyone who is part of Phase 3, return their completed forms to us as soon as possible. If you have lost or misplaced your form, you can obtain a copy by going to our website at warwick-bucks.org (permits and forms) or you can pick them up at the township administration building.

In 2011, Warwick Township adopted the on-lot sewage maintenance ordinance to ensure basic maintenance of on-lot septic systems in the township. Septic tanks must be pumped at intervals not to exceed three years. You only need to register for the program one time but you will be notified every three years in reference to pumping your tank. Pumping your tank regularly will greatly reduce the chance of accumulated solids escaping the tank and clogging other components especially, the drainfield which is the most critical component of most septic systems. In addition, pumping the tank regularly will prolong the life of any on-lot system.





## HELP KEEP POLLUTION OUT OF STORM DRAINS



Only rain in the drain! That's because storm drains and roadside ditches lead directly to our streams, lakes and rivers. So, any oil, pet waste, leaves, trash, or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our streams, lakes and rivers.

## WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Simple. These tips will help prevent pollutants from entering our streams, lakes and rivers:

- Sweep fertilizer off of driveways and sidewalks, back onto your lawn.
- Keep leaves, grass clippings, trash, and fertilizers out of storm drains.
- Do not dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain.
- Volunteer to label the storm drains in your neighborhood to inform your neighbors that storm drains flow directly to our streams, lakes and rivers.

## **KEEP OUR WATER CLEAN!**

To report an illicit discharge to the storm water collection system or to a storm drain or to a stream, lake or river, please call the Township office at 215-343-6100.

## A NOTE FROM THE TAX OFFICE

Real Estate tax bills are mailed March 1st and July 1st each year. Interim bills are mailed for any changes made to your property within 30 days after receiving a change of assessment notice from the County of Bucks. If you do not receive a tax bill, please contact Denise at the Tax Office at 215-491-0611 or email Warwicktaxbetts@ aol.com. We also have an email reminder list you may request to be added to. You must always notify the tax office of address changes as soon as possible. New owners or any owner that has had a change in their deed please remember to apply for the Homestead Exemption by March 1st (owner occupied property only). This office only collects for Real

## WARWICK TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Warwick Police Department serves the 15,000 residents of Warwick Township, as well as our business community, public school population, and visitors and travelers. Our current authorized strength is 18 sworn officers, with 17 officers on staff. We expect to hire the 18th officer in the 2nd quarter of 2017. The Department sponsors several specialty units, including Investigations, Traffic Safety, Crime Scene Investigation, and regional SWAT. Our Department prides itself on providing the highest level of service



to our community. As a Department, we are especially proud of our officers. Most live within 15 minutes of Warwick Township. We closely identify with the needs of our community, because the Warwick community is our community. Of our 17 current officers, we have one veteran (USMC), and two women. Nine of our officers have bachelor's degrees, and five have graduate degrees. All officers have earned a significant number of college credits.

For approximately the last 10 years, our Police Department has been certified by the PA Dept. of Health as a Quick Response Service (QRS). A QRS unit is made up of staff holding certification as Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT). They respond to emergency medical calls and have more specialized equipment. Our officers respond with paramedics to almost all medical calls in Warwick, and our 4 EMT's are able to offer service at a higher level than the 1st Aid that is traditionally available until paramedics arrive.

Another lifesaving service we provide is Narcan (naloxone), to counteract the effects of an opiate overdose. We were one of the first police agencies in Bucks County to train our officers and carry this life saving medicine, and as of this writing, we have saved 11 people.

Our Department has 2 officers assigned to the Central Bucks Special Response Team (CBSRT). The team is made up of approximately 18 police departments from Warminster to Quakertown and Richland, who receive special training to handle critical incidents involving the most dangerous people we encounter. These officers have apprehended homicide suspects, armed robbers, and other dangerous felons.

Also attached to CBSRT is our regional Crime Scene Unit. This team is comprised of detectives from our participating agencies. Most are nationally recognized as crime scene technicians, after undergoing comprehensive training from the FBI and a rigorous testing process. The team leader is our detective sergeant, Dante Montella.

Of the 17 police officers in Warwick, two are assigned to investigations, and serve as detectives. Three other officers served at least 2 years in the detective's office, and all of our officers have attained a high level of competency in investigating crime. Our detectives routinely investigate burglaries, thefts and other property crimes, assaults, robberies, and sex crimes. This past July, we investigated our first homicide case in 27 years. Our officers and detectives worked closely with detectives from the Bucks County District Attorney's Office and neighboring police departments and were able to quickly apprehend a suspect.



The Police Department has been kept quite busy over the last year. In September, Cpl. Paul Fox and 2 medics from Warminster Ambulance received lifesaving awards for rescuing a person trapped in a burning home in Stover Mill.

Our officers participate in a DUI task Force with other Bucks County police departments and the District Attorney's Office. Several times each year, these departments come together and conduct checkpoints or focused patrols in different areas in Bucks County. Unfortunately, these details result in quite a volume of DUI arrests, as well as arrests for an assortment of other violations.

Along with the Parks and Recreation Department and Township Administration, the Police Department is active on social media. We maintain a Twitter account, and encourage all to "follow" us @warwickpdbucks. As often as possible, we "tweet" information regarding traffic crashes, road closures, safety and crime information. We currently have over 1500 followers.

## HARTSVILLE FIRE COMPANY

2017 marks the 94th year of volunteer community service for the Hartsville Fire Co. What was once a rural crossroads

in a farming community has developed into a busy suburban area. Old York Road and Bristol Roads is known as the "Crossroads of History" in reference to the stage coach that stopped at the old Hartsville Hotel and the encampment of Washington's Army in the summer of 1777.

Our volunteer firefighters train weekly on Tuesday nights. In addition to fire training, skills are maintained in vehicle rescue, water rescue, hazmat operations and CPR/First Aid/EMT. Many of our firefighters have achieved their Emergency Medical Technician Certification.



A major 2016 expense was the purchase all new radios as part of the new Bucks County Radio system. Our \$150,000. cost will be spread over seven years thanks to a loan from Bucks County. New breathing apparatus were also purchased and placed in service during the year. With help from a \$110,000. federal grant and fire company savings we were able to pay the \$160,000. cost. Federal standards require the replacement of breathing equipment every 15 years.

Our goal for 2017 is to place an order for a new Engine for delivery in 2018 to replace our 1998 truck. We anticipate an expenditure of \$450,000. Our savings, the sale of the existing truck and a loan from the State of Pennsylvania will cover the cost.

Annual expenses for insurance provided for our members (\$40,000) and 5 sets of new turnout gear (helmets, boot, pants & coat) at \$3200, per set are the normal parts of our \$300,000 annual operating budget.

Providing firefighters with proper protective equipment is the least we can do to support their volunteer efforts. Our labor is free, but we train and operate to the national standards. It is a matter of pride to perform our chosen duties to the best of our abilities. All new firefighters must obtain their National Firefighter One Certification from the Bucks County Emergency Services Training Center before they can ride the apparatus to emergencies.

## If you would like to be a firefighter, please consider the following:

Cadet Firefighters (14 & 15 years of age) meet ever Wednesday night from 7 to 8:30 PM. Cadets received turnout gear and are taught basic firefighting skills. It is an opportunity for young people to try out their ability to lean new kills and work with the fire equipment. This meant to be a fun hands-on experience. You are welcome to join us even if you live outside of the "Hartsville" area; however, when you turn 16 you must leave and join the fire station closest to your home.

**Junior Firefighters (15 & 16 years of age)** meet and work with the senior firefighters every Tuesday night from 7 to 9 PM. In addition to turnout gear they are eligible to attend that portion of the Firefighter One class allowed by the Pennsylvania Child Labor laws. No interior firefighting is permitted until you turn 18. Juniors who obtain the FF1 for Juniors are permitted to ride the fire trucks to emergency calls for exterior firefighting only.

Senior Firefighters (18 years of age and over) meet every Tuesday night from 7 to 9 PM. They must obtain the FF1 National Certification before they are permitted to ride the apparatus to calls. A complete set of turn out gear, life insurance, emergency medical insurance, workmen's compensation insurance, personal breathing mask, Class A & B uniforms, pager and participation in all fire company activities are offered.

Warwick Township Fire Company No. 1 is an all volunteer fire company founded in 1958. We are the primary fire protection unit for Warwick Township. We have approximately 40 active personnel operating 4 trucks from our station (Rescue, Engine, Tower, Tanker). One of the biggest milestones that Warwick Township Fire Company No. 1 had in 2016 is that we are now a 501(c)(3) organization. This now allows for matching grants in the workplace if your employer allows this. This also may allow some direct donations to the fire company to be tax deductible (please check with your accountant for more on this).

Our Fire Police unit consists of 10 members. Their primary responsibility is traffic control, crowd control and scene safety at fire incidents. They also work with the Warwick Township Police Department at accident scenes and other incidents.

If you have thought about volunteering in your community, Warwick Fire Company is always looking for volunteers. We have openings for firefighters, fire police, or administrative personnel.

To become a firefighter, you must be a minimum or 14 years old. Between the ages of 14-17, the member is considered a junior firefighter. These members are limited by law as to what they are able to do (no interior firefighting, no operating power tools, among other restrictions). However, they are able to assist in other ways.

Once the member reaches the age of 18, they are considered a firefighter. The firefighter will need to be Firefighter 1 (FF1) certified before being allowed to go into burning buildings, operating cutting tools, etc. We will send you to the Bucks County Public Safety Training Center for this education. FF1 is a 192 hour course over several months. In this course, you will learn how to be a safe and proficient firefighter. Our drills on Tuesday evenings will expand on this training and show you the specifics of our apparatus, tools, and gear.

There are many other courses that can be taken during your career such as Basic Vehicle Rescue (learn the technique to safely remove an entrapped victim from a car), Pump Operator (to learn how to work the pump on the trucks to send water through the hoses), Emergency Vehicle Driver Training (EVDT – How to safely operate an emergency vehicle during an emergency and non emergency), along with many other programs and specialized training.

To be a Fire Police Officer, you will need to take the Basic Fire Police course (16 hours over 1 weekend). This shows you how to direct traffic, explains some of the pertinent motor vehicle laws, and techniques for crowd control that you may use. You will then be sworn in by the local magistrate and registered with the local police. Other courses

available to the Fire Police Officer include Advanced Fire Police, Communications, and Legal Concepts.

These members could assist us in fund raising (planning and executing fundraising events), office work (we are a small business so help is needed in the financial office, administrative wing, secretarial work), truck maintenance (the trucks and officer's vehicles need to keep running efficiently), etc. Even though we are supported by your tax dollars, this does not cover us for all of our expenses during the year so the fundraising aspect is a huge part of the volunteer life.

Warminster Volunteer Ambulance Corps (WVAC) is a community based emergency medical services agency located in the heart of Bucks County. WVAC is a registered 501 (c)3 non-profit charitable organization, with stations in both Warwick and Warminster Townships. With approximately fifty members, comprised of both volunteers and paid staff, WVAC offers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year advanced life support for medical emergencies dispatched through the 911 service. With over 4000 calls per year, Warminster Volunteer Ambulance Corps has responded to over 550 calls in Warwick Township, in 2016.



In order to provide these services, WVAC requires certification and continued training of all of its EMS staff. In 2016, Warminster Volunteer Ambulance Corps was recognized for the organization's focus on training and patient care, when it received an American Heart Association Mission: Lifeline Gold award for stellar care of high risk stroke patients. WVAC also received recognition from both Warwick and Warminster Townships' Board of Supervisors for the high level of care provided to township residents, along with a brand new facility, sponsored by Warwick Township.

The demands of operating around the clock on behalf of every call that comes in, are high. Current legislation has made it difficult for ambulance services in Pennsylvania to receive reimbursement for EMS responses provided. As a result, WVAC has needed to rely on community donations to stay in service. ## FIRE MARSHAL ON FIRE SAFETY

What you don't know can hurt you. This old statement is certainly true when there is smoke in your house. Smoke is nature's pre-fire warning. If you don't know there is smoke in your house, you can expect that smoke to develop into a fire.

In our overall effort to reduce the potential for a serious fire in Warwick Township, the smoke detectors (and other safety issues) of every home that is sold are inspected. Owners of homes being sold must replace or add smoke detectors to meet the following standard. A smoke detector is required in every bedroom, on each level, the garage and each room in the basement. All detectors must communicate with each other so that when any detector senses smoke, they all make noise. Detectors can be "hardwired', "wireless" or a combination of both.

More that 50% of our township homes have a sprinkler system as well as a smoke detector system that meets the above standard. These are not only the safest homes in the township they are among the safest in the country.

Any detectors 10 years or older old must be replaced. The history of smoke detectors show that they were designed to last 10 years and they have an increasing failure rate the older they get.

Pushing the test button on a smoke detector only tests the power supply (110 volts or battery voltage). To completely test the detector it must be subject to smoke. Smoke detectors have the following functions:

- Their ability to sense smoke.
- Their electronic ability to relay the sensing to the horn.
- And the ability for the horn to make noise.

Should anyone of these functions fail, the detector fails. Pushing the test button only tests item #3 (the power supply). A full test of the smoke detectors requires smoke. Artificial smoke is sold in an aerosol can for this purpose.

## If your smoke detectors are connected by wires (hardwired) or wirelessly they have these functions:

- Their ability to sense smoke.
- Their electronic ability to relay the sensing to the horn within the sensing detector.
- Their ability to also send the signal to the other detectors.
- The receiving detector's ability to receive the signal electronically.
- And the ability of the receiving detector to make noise.

Every detector must be checked with smoke to insure all of these functions occur. If not, the detector fails.

Smoke doesn't pass through walls or doors. It is important to have a detector in every room to sense the earliest presence of smoke and send that signal to all of the detectors in your home. This provides you with noise in your bedroom when you are asleep. You won't hear the detector in your garage or basement from your bedroom while you are sleeping. This is when you are most vulnerable to undetected smoke and fire.

With few exceptions, everyone who has been injured or died in a fire was home at the time the fire began. They didn't become aware of their situation until it was too late. What you don't know can hurt you.

Fire doesn't discriminate. People who believe that a fire can't occur in their home are mistaken. No one plans to have a fire in their home. Most all fires are considered an accident and most all can be prevented by having a complete smoke detector warning system. Anything less than that is a gamble.

Every electrical appliance, outlet, wire, extension cord, power strip, candle, cigarette, etc. has a fire potential. Recalled products are in our homes long before they are recalled. It is actual fire incident investigations that determine the fire cause that eventually lead to a recall. No home is exempt from a fire. If you have never upgraded your detectors you are overdue.

"Wireless" detectors are battery powered and send a signal to all of the similar wireless detectors. When one senses smoke, they all make noise, They are the equivalent of a "hardwired' smoke detectors system without the need for wires. They install like the old battery detectors, but provide a system that matches that of a brand new 2017 home. They are the new technology for older homes

Smoke detectors that are not interconnected are obsolete. They do not meet the current Fire Code and they must be upgraded when you sell your home. Don't wait to upgrade your home's fire safety for the next family. Do it for yours.

Trash haulers will no longer accept televisions and computer monitors along with the regular trash pick up. The Township has compiled a list of some companies that can help you get rid of those old electronics. As of December 2016, this is the most current information; however, rates and availability are subject to change at any time.
