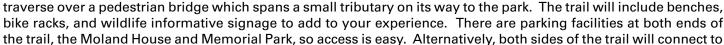

From the Board of Supervisors...

With the completion of Warwick Memorial Park this summer, the Township Supervisors are focusing their attention to our next major recreation project – the Headquarters Trail connection. Back in 2017, the township was awarded \$500,000 through the federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) to fund the construction of a 10' wide multi-use trail which will connect the Moland House to Warwick Memorial Park. This trail is an important addition to the Board of Supervisors' plan to link Warwick Township neighborhoods via walking and biking connections.

The trail will start at the intersection of Eddowes Road and Old York Road, meander through the Moland House grounds, wander underneath York Road (Rte. 263), and





existing trails and sidewalks in Warwick Township. Neighborhoods as north as Guinea Lane can walk, jog, or ride down Turkeytrot Rd or Meyer Way to Meetinghouse Road and connect to the trail at Eddowes Road. Additionally, an existing trail and bridge on Creek Road connects into the neighborhoods of Heritage Creek, Gabriel Lane, Country Crossings and Stover Mill to the south.

Furthermore, the Warwick Township Board of Supervisors, under the direction of Chairperson Judith Algeo, has remained committed to providing this new and exciting trail system in our new park without increasing property taxes in 10 years.

REMINDER

Phase 2 On-Lot Sewage Visual Inspection Forms For 2019

In January 2019, the Township sent letters to all households in phase 2 of the Warwick Township on-lot sewage management program. These households are required to have their on-lot sewage system pumped by December 31, 2019. They must file a visual inspection form that is to be filled out by their waste hauler. **We also need a copy of the receipt from their hauler**.

Warwick Township is requesting that anyone who is part of phase 2, return their completed forms to us as soon as possible. If you have lost or misplaced your form, you can obtain a copy by going to our website www.warwickbucks.org (permits and forms) or you can pick them up at the Township administration building.

In 2011, Warwick Township adopted the on-lot sewage maintenance ordinance to ensure basic maintenance of on-lot septic systems in the township. Septic tanks must be pumped at intervals not to exceed three years. You only need to register for the program one-time but you will be notified every three years in reference to pumping your tank. Pumping your tank regularly will greatly reduce the chance of accumulated solids escaping the tank and clogging other components especially the drain field which is the most critical component of most septic systems. In addition, pumping the tank regularly will prolong the life of any on-lot system.

2020 Census Information

It's that time again! Every ten (10) years the U.S. Census Bureau is required to take a head count of all people residing in the United States. Why are population totals important?

- They determine the number of seats each state has in the House of Representatives.
- They are used to redraw legislative and school districts.
- They affect federal funding in communities.
- They help decisions makers know how communities are changing for purposes such as transportation and facility needs.

Working From Home

Are you working out of your home? If so, here is what you need to know. Warwick Township would like to remind residents that a zoning permit is required for all Home Occupations.

What is a "home occupation?"

A home occupation is an accessory use that is clearly subordinate to the existing residential use of the property. There is a \$100 registration fee for a home occupation, as well as a \$50 annual renewal fee. Failure to register a home occupation could result in a non-traffic citation and penalties up to and including \$1,000 per day plus court fees as determined by the District Justice.

What types of home occupations are there?

Home occupations in Warwick Township come in the following types:

- Professional Offices (salesperson, architect, engineer, doctor, lawyer, accountant, etc.)
- Personal Services (barber, beautician, photographer, etc.)
- Instructional Services (teaching maximum of four students at a time)
- Home Crafts (artist, sculptor, tailor, rug weaving, lapidary work, furniture making, etc.)
- Business Trades (electrician, plumber, landscaper, carpenter, mason, painter, roofer, etc.)
- Repair services (repair for small appliances, watches, bicycles, locks, etc. but NOT cars, trucks, snow mobiles, ATV's outboard motors, or jet skis)
- Family day care (supervising children not related to the caregiver)
- No-Impact Home Based Business (There are general standards that apply to all home occupations and then there are specific standards that apply to different types of home occupations.)

What if I don't have any customers or clients come to visit me?

If no one other than family members is involved in the business, there is no display or sale of retail goods, continued on next page

there are no signs, the activity doesn't generate more sewage than a typical residence and the activity doesn't occupy more than 25% of the habitable area of the home, the business will probably be considered a "No-impact Home-Based Business." A permit is still required. With a proper permit, No-Impact Home-Based Businesses are allowed in all zoning districts.

Where can I have a home occupation?

A home occupation is either permitted by right, permitted by special exception, or not permitted depending on the type of home occupation and the zoning district where the property of located. "Permitted by right" means that if the owner applies for a permit and meets all the regulations in the ordinance, they will be issued a permit. "Permitted by special exception" means the applicant has to apply to the Zoning Hearing Board for permission to operate that type of home occupation in that location. "Not permitted" means that a particular type of home occupation is not allowed in a particular district.

What are some of the general rules and regulations that apply to home occupations?

The home occupation must be carried on wholly indoors. The appearance of the home cannot be altered to cause it to be different from the surrounding homes. Home occupations cannot create noise, vibration, glare, fumes, odors, dust, or electrical interference.

FALL STORMWATER TIPS

Fall is the time of year when school starts back up and the leaves begin to fall. As you are working outside and enjoying the cooler weather, remember these tips to protect our environment and water.

Leaf Litter and Yard Waste

- Leaf litter and any yard waste can cause harmful nutrient accumulation in nearby waterways.
- Dispose of leaf litter and yard waste in a compost pile or use for mulch or fertilizer.
- Do not rake leaves into storm drains, streets or waterways.

Plant a Tree

Fall is a great time to plant a tree. Trees absorb the runoff and reduce amount of water that will runoff into the streets and waterways.

Prune your Trees and Shrubs

Pruning trees and shrubs in the fall will give them a good start in the spring growing season. It will also help them to use more water in the spring to reduce the runoff.

Aerate your Lawn

Aeration involves perforating the soil with small holes to allow air, water and nutrients to penetrate the grass roots for a healthy lawn. Aeration helps the roots grow deeply, reduces soil compaction and restores your lawns natural draining ability resulting in less runoff to our streams.

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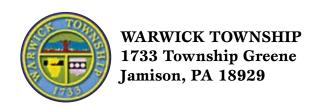
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
