Central Bucks School Real Estate tax bills were mailed July 1st. If you would like to pay at a discount, the due date is August 31st. Drop box and mail in payments are appreciated. The County Township Real Estate tax bills were mailed March 1st and are now past due. They are due at the penalty amount. Unpaid Taxes as of December 31st will be liened at Bucks County Tax Claim. If you have not received a tax bill it is important to contact Denise at the Tax office 215-491-0611 or e-mail Warwicktaxbetts@aol.com. Please update the Tax office of any address changes. Due to the challenging times, call the tax office for updated hours. New homeowners please note there is a 1% earned income tax. You must file a return by April 15th for the previous year with Keystone. This office collects only real estate taxes. The earned and LST tax Collector is Keystone Collections. PLUG IN AT THE PARK

The appeal of electric vehicles is growing. Automakers are expanding their lines making electric cars with better performance and more aestheticaly stylish. With this grant, we were able to install a Level Two Leviton Chargepoint charging station in the parking lot at Warwick Community Park, 1733 Township Greene, Jamison. This Level Two electric supply equipment is in the perfect location for residents to enjoy our park and walking path, while charging up their electric vehicle. Two charging ports share a single circuit, making it virtually guaranteed to have a spot waiting for you when you need to boost your battery. And, thanks to a generous donation from Renk Electric, our Leviton is equipped with a cord management system. This estimated \$1,150 cord management system, will extend the life of the electric cords on the station. The retractable system will also ensure that when you arrive to plug in, the cords will never be on the ground, but hanging conveniently in place. Warwick is working with great companies to do great things for our community.












HEADQUARTERS TRAIL TO OPEN IN 2020

In 2017, Warwick Township was awarded a statewide grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PENNDOT) though the TAP program to build a trail that connects the historic Moland House to the newly opened Memorial Park. The TAP program (Transportation Alternative Programs) provides funding for programs and projects defined as transportation alternatives, including on- and off-road pedestrian and bicycle facilities, infrastructure projects for improving non-driver access to public transportation and enhanced mobility, community improvement activities and environmental mitigation, trails that serve a transportation purpose and safe routes to school projects. Warwick Township received \$500,000 to complete the project.

The trail, called Headquarters Trail, will start at the entrance to the Moland House on the Old York Road side and will go under York Road, through the woods, over a new bridge that spans a small tributary of the Little Neshaminy Creek and connect to the trail system in Memorial Park.

A local contractor will be completing this project through PENNDOT, starting in late Summer and should be completed before winter.

A full day was spent searching, and once again, there were no sightings of the creature that was exploring Warwick Township.

At long last, on May 6, we caught the first glimpse of the face of our elusive wanderer. Township security cameras recording what appeared to be a 7' tall, pink haired animal, peeking in through township windows. Park & Recreation knew it was time to call in the pros. Warwick Police joined in the search to locate this critter and find out who he was. The police department reviewed security footage, took footprint measurements and pink fur samples. SAFETY TOWN IS OPEN!

Some might ask, what is Safety Town? Safety Town is a miniaturized version of Warwick Township where young children can ride tricycles and big wheels and play in a make-believe town. All the store fronts and street buildings are local businesses and the street markings have been shrunk down to smaller size to help teach the importance of street safety to our youngsters. The buildings have been designed for interactive play. There is plenty to spur the imagination of any child!

Building facades are made from recycled plastic lumber. Building facades come in two sizes, Standard (5') or Deluxe (10') for a five (5) year term. Each building is equipped with open doors and windows to allow for creative play.

Safety Town is located in Memorial Park at 1200 Memorial Drive.

Our Public Works Department was able to build 18

buildings in the first phase due to the sponsors that now have a place in our town. 


DISCOUNTED TICKETS

3 REASONS TO SCOOP THAT POOP

1. First and Foremost, It's the Law! Township Code Section 63 requires any person having care, custody or control of an animal to pick up after it. Furthermore, it requires appropriate disposal of the fecal matter which may mean carrying it with you until you can find a proper receptacle.



2. Cleanliness & Disease Control. Picking up and properly disposing of animal waste will keep pests from being attracted to the area due to odor. It will also

ensure common diseases won't be transmitted and contaminated feces won't end up in our waterways and/or soils.

3. Common Courtesy. If you haven't ever stepped in a pile those who have will tell you it is an unpleasant experience. Scooping poop will ensure everyone has the same opportunity to enjoy the areas you and your animals do.







PLANT BUFFERS ALONG OUR STREAMS AND PONDS

What is a Buffer and Why is it needed?

A riparian buffer along a stream, creek or pond is a vegetated area to help the water quality in the waterway. The vegetated area provides shade, filters the water that runs off the adjacent land into the waterway. During a rain event the water running to the streams picks up soil, fertilizers and pesticides from lawns, and oil and grease from roads or driveways. Slowing the water down before it reaches the stream also helps to prevent erosion of the soil and streambanks.

How do I plant a Buffer?

Typically a buffer area consists of 3 zones. The size of each zone will vary depending on the space available.

- Zone 1: Along the edge of the stream, creek or pond should be planted with native trees and shrubs that can tolerate wet conditions.
- Zone 2: Adjacent to Zone 1, plant native trees and shrubs plus wildflowers and grasses to provide a transition.
- Zone 3: Next to Zone 2, plant an area of native grasses and wildflowers to slow the water and allow some to be absorbed into the ground.

How do I Maintain the Buffer?

- Initially, the buffer will need to be maintained with watering and weeding to help the plants establish and remove invasive plants.
- The grasses and wildflowers in Zone 3 should be mowed twice a year, in the spring and fall, to prevent overgrowth.

• The trees and shrubs should be pruned to remove any dead, dying or diseased branches.




