From the Board of Supervisors...

There are few volunteer positions as important right now as being a volunteer firefighter for our community. The Warwick Township Fire Company is a 100% volunteer organization providing 24/7 fire service in Warwick Township and our surrounding municipalities.



Unfortunately, Pennsylvania has experienced a dramatic reduction in local fire company volunteers. In the 1970's, there were 300,000 fire company volunteers in Pennsylvania. The number of volunteers is now under 50,000. Sadly, no community is unaffected by lower volunteerism.

Warwick Township, proudly served by the Warwick Township Fire Company, is no exception to these statistics. While a strong membership persists, there

is a growing need for new, lively and active volunteers. Volunteers can come in all shapes and sizes. For those less adventurous,

> there are many positions in the fire company other than emergency responders. Volunteers with all types of backgrounds and careers, ranging from carpenters and business owners to accountants and engineers, can make meaningful contributions to the fire company. Even younger Warwick





residents (14 and up) can volunteer as junior firefighters and it may make for a fulfilling activity between a parent and child. Also, there is no minimum amount of volunteering time to join, you can give time when you have it.

Your local firefighters are the first responders when you need help. Their duties range from house fires and vehicle accidents to alarm response and fire safety

training. When the type of service warrants, our firefighters respond alongside our police and emergency medical services.

Volunteering for the Warwick Fire Company can award you with not only the thrill of riding on the back of a fire engine, but also with a sense of community while working alongside your neighbors to create a safer place for all of us to live, work and play. Lastly, the township funds a monetary stipend program for volunteer firefighters to help offset incidental expenses.

Looking Forward To Fall At The Tax Office - Denise Betts Tax Collector

Central Bucks School Real Estate tax bills were mailed July 1st. If you would like to pay at discount, the due date is August 31st. To avoid penalties, please pay by October 31st. The County Township Real Estate tax bills were mailed March 1st and are now past due. They are due at the penalty amount. Drop box for tax payments always available. Unpaid taxes as of Dec. 31st will be liened at Bucks County Tax Claim. If you have not received a tax bill, it is important to contact Denise at the tax office 215-491-0611 or e-mail Warwicktaxbetts@aol.com. Please update the tax office of any address changes. This office only collects real estate taxes. New homeowners, please note, there is a 1% earned income tax. The earned and LST tax collector is Keystone Collections. You can contact them at 1-888-328-0565 or their website Keystonecollects.com. You must file a return by April 15th (for the previous year) with Keystone.

Know Your Local Wildlife - Things You May Not Have Known About Fall Leaves

Did you know a leaf layer can be extremely beneficial? Butterfly and moth species use the leaf layer to overwinter, leaves provide protection for their young so they can develop into their adult form next year. Most bird species rely on this layer for a food source due to the caterpillars, as well as insects, living there. Ninety-six (96%) of birds rely on caterpillars to feed their young! Beyond this small mammals, salamanders, turtles, and frogs also use this layer as their home. You would be providing an important habitat if you keep the leaves on your property rather than dispose of them. One way of doing this is using leaves in garden beds and other areas where you may want to protect your plants. Leaves are a natural mulch; they not only provide nutrients to the soil but suppress weeds and preserve moisture. This could save you both time and money with next year's landscaping.



Barbecue Grill Safety - Robert Prato, Fire Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer

Grilling is one of the most popular ways to cook. There is nothing better than freshly grilled foods during an outdoor picnic. Safety, while grilling, should be at the top of the menu.

According to the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA) an average of 19,700 patients a year go to emergency rooms because of grill related injuries. Thermal burns make up almost half of these injuries. Whether charcoal or gas fired, grills should be treated like they are an appliance, just like a stove or oven. Working around a hot grill should be done with extra care since flash or grease fires can occur any time without much warning. Children or pets playing around a hot grill is never a good idea. And use of hot gloves and proper utensils for grilling can prevent some of these injuries.

Grills are involved in roughly 9,000 home fires each year. The major causes are leaks and breaks. One of these recently did a significant amount of damage to a home in our Township.

Propane, natural gas, or charcoal grills should only be used outside. They produce significant amounts of carbon monoxide and can be dangerous or even deadly if used indoors. Keeping the grill at least fifteen feet from the side of structures or any other combustible materials is an easy way to prevent damage from the heat of a grill. Make sure the grill lid is open when you light the burners.

For propane and natural gas grills, check the gas tank hose or supply hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A gas leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank or supply line and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the



fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move or touch the grill. If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

Charcoal and wood or pellet grills need careful attention when in use as well. Use a safe means to start the fuel such as newspapers. If you use charcoal lighter fluid, only put it on cold coals or fuels. Never use gasoline or other volatile fuels to start a grill. And never add any flammable liquids to the fire once it has been lit, even if it appears to be out. It may not be and could create a hazardous situation very quickly. An electric charcoal starter is a desirable alternative to using liquid fuels to start the coals, but care should be taken to avoid burn injuries or other potential hazards with these. When you are finished with a solid fuel grill, let the coals completely cool before disposing of the ash in a metal container.

Following these guidelines while grilling will ensure that you have a tasty and safe grilling season!





Ways Everyone Can Help Keep our Streams Clean

As part of our Stormwater Permit with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, the Township is required to help prevent pollution and keep our streams clean for drinking water, irrigation, fishing and enjoyment by the public. Here are some ways you can help keep our streams and rivers clean:

- 1. Keep your nearest storm drain clear of debris and litter
- 2. Never dump anything down a storm drain
- 3. Use fertilizers sparingly
- 4. Use pesticides only when necessary
- 5. Do not blow grass clippings or leaves into the street
- 6. Sweep up yard debris rather than hosing down paved areas
- 7. Compost or recycle yard waste
- 8. Pick up pet waste and dispose of properly
- 9. Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on an unpaved area
- 10. Service your car regularly to prevent leaks onto paved areas
- 11. Dispose of Household Hazardous Waste at designated collection locations
- 12. Produce less waste Reduce, Reuse, Recycle
- 13. Purchase and use nontoxic, biodegradable, recycled or recyclable products whenever possible
- 14. Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected at least every three years

Parks and Open Space Rules Reminder

We hope you enjoy coming to the parks in our park system. We want to remind all park visitors of the rules posted in every park so all in attendance can have a pleasant visit.

- Parks are open sunrise to sunset except for areas that have lights like the basketball courts and hockey rink.
- Pets must be leashed and pet refuse must be disposed of. We provide mutt mitts in most of our parks.
- No abusive language or aggressive behavior; profane language; lewd or sexually explicit conduct.
- Unreasonable noise is prohibited.
- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
- Motorized vehicles and motorized off-road vehicles, including golf carts are prohibited.
- No discharge of firearms.
- It is prohibited to bring to the park any type of weapon, excluding firearms, but including but not limited to air soft guns, BB/pellet guns, paintball guns, sling shots, knives/swords over 3", potato guns, etc.

-))) If a person is struck by lightning, call 9-1-1. Get medical help right away.
