We are pleased to announce that Warwick Township was the recipient of a 50% matching grant to reconstruct and enhance the very popular Community Park spray pool. The spray pool is a park amenity used by a large portion of our community. From Memorial Day to Labor Day, the pool is crowded with kids and adults of all ages trying to find relief from the heat and enjoy time outdoors.

The spray pool is also often used in conjunction with park pavilion rentals. From birthday parties to anniversaries, the spray pool is a significant component in many families' decision to rent a pavilion in Community Park.

The grant will allow us to reconstruct the spray pool with new features such as multiple spray points, seating, and new surfacing. While the exact timing of construction is not yet known at the time of this publication, township staff will work to ensure the spray pool is either replaced before or after the 2023 summer season.

- >>> Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.



Have activities that keep kids out of the kitchen during this busy time. Games, puzzles or books can keep them busy. Kids can get involved in Thanksgiving preparations with recipes that can be done outside the kitchen.

Body Worn Cameras

In 2021, the Warwick Township Police Department applied for and received a grant from the PA Commission on Crime and Delinquency to fund the purchase of Watchguard BODY WORN CAMERAS (BWC). Our Department has utilized dashboard cameras for almost 20 years. As time has passed, our society has come to expect that police officers will document their activities through the use of this technology.





In anticipation of implementing BWCs, our Board of Supervisors adopted a Body Worn Camera policy to comply with industry standards, codify recording retention duration, and ensure uniform utilization. During April 2022, the server and docking stations were installed, and the cameras were distributed for use. They have integrated seamlessly with our other technology and general operations. Body worn cameras provide an amazing level of documentation and accountability. Officers review video footage regularly, to assist in recalling important details and to note things they might have missed. Our supervisors and leaders review video footage to ensure our officers comply with our rules and regulations, and applicable laws. We also use the videos as a basis for in-house training. Officers can see themselves and their colleagues and the tactics used in resolving an event. It's a great way to learn about what worked, what didn't, and what we can do better next time.

Warm Greetings From The Tax Office

Real Estate tax bills for 2022 were mailed March 1st and July 1st. If you did not pay your current tax bill, they are in penalty now. Notices are mailed in November for unpaid tax invoices. Liens for unpaid tax bills for 2022 will be turned over to Bucks County Tax Claim in December. Please update the tax office of any address changes. New homeowners or deed changes, please remember to apply for the Homestead reduction through Bucks County Board of Assessment by March 1, 2023. Know Your Local Wildlife - Benefits of Dead Trees

You may find dead or downed trees unsightly or a nuisance but these trees play an important role for wildlife. Deadwood in and of itself will be decomposed by fungi and other living organisms which returns vital nutrients into the ecosystem aiding in healthier soil and new plant growth. Birds of prey such as owls, hawks, and eagles utilize dead branches in the treetops to get a good view of potential prey while hunting. Other birds use this same tactic when capturing flying insects. Many birds and mammals use the cavities in dead wood as nesting sites and for protection. Dead and downed trees are often filled with insects which become a valuable food source for birds and mammals alike. Next time you are removing dead trees or fallen or decaying wood in an area that is not a potential hazard to people or property it may be worth considering the benefits of leaving them in place for wildlife.

Why you should care about Stormwater?

• What is Stormwater?

Stormwater runoff is the water from a rain event or snow melt that runs across the ground. Stormwater may infiltrate into the ground, runoff into storm sewers and streams, evaporate into the air or be used by plants.

• Why is Stormwater a problem?

- Stormwater running across lawns, roads, driveways, and parking lots can pick up pollutants such as oil, fertilizers, salt, dirt/sediment and trash and carry these pollutants to the storm sewers and streams.
- With more development, there are more surfaces that do not allow the water to infiltrate which increases the volume of water flowing into our storm sewers and streams causing more frequent flooding.
- The increased flow in streams causes more streambank erosion. The erosion eats away at the ground adjacent to the stream and soil is carried away in the stream which damages the natural habitat for fish and other aquatic life.

• How can you help?

There are many ways a homeowner can help protect our streams. Here are some ways you can help:

- Reduce the amount of mowed grass and plant native trees and shrubs which have larger root systems.
- Reduce impervious areas that prevent the stormwater from infiltrating into the ground. Use pervious paving systems for walkways and patios.
- · Do not over fertilize.
- Install a rain barrel to irrigate your garden.
- Create a rain garden to collect rain water and allow it to infiltrate or be used by the plants.

Fire company members will be accepting non-perishable food donations while visiting your neighborhood. The food collected from the Santa Run is donated to three Central Bucks food pantries. We appreciate and thank you in advance for your food donation.



There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!

- Keep anything that can burn at least three-feet (one metre) away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot (one metre) "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.

Heating Equipment Smarts

Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.

Smoke Detectors Are The First And Most Important Step In Fire Safety

Warwick Township Code requires an "interconnected smoke detector" in every bedroom, on every level, in the garage and every room in the basement with a door. When any detector senses smoke, every detector sounds, alerting the occupants of the earliest occurrence of smoke. This provides time to escape, but it also gives a chance to find and eliminate the cause of the smoke, which may prevent the smoke from becoming a larger fire.

Wireless technology is being used in smoke detectors now, allowing existing homes to have an interconnected smoke alarm system installed without the expense of installing wires. Homeowners can add detectors as their budget allows until every room is protected.

By installing detectors in every room, everyone in the home on every level will hear the sound the moment one detector senses smoke. Evacuate everyone from the residence, call the fire department and then if you can safely do so, search for the source. Remove, unplug, or use a fire extinguisher to control the situation. If this is not possible, wait for the fire department to arrive since they are equipped to manage these occurrences.

Warwick residents who are looking to sell their homes must make this upgrade to obtain the needed Use & Occupancy Certificate. This certificate is required for settlement. Why not be as safe as possible while you are still living in your home? Install them now and have the peace of mind that you are protected. Outdoor Safety

- If you can hear thunder, you are within striking distance of lightning. Look for shelter inside a home, large building, or a hard-topped vehicle right away.
- Do not go under trees for shelter. There is no place outside that is safe during a thunderstorm.
- Wait at least 30 minutes after hearing the last clap of thunder before leaving your shelter.
-))) Stay away from windows and doors. Stay off porches.
- There is no safe place outside. Places with only a roof on sports fields, golf courses, and picnic areas are not safe during a lightning storm. Small sheds should not be used.
- If a person is struck by lightning, call 9-1-1. Get medical help right away.

Indoor Safety

Turn off computers. Stay off corded phones, computers, and other things that put you in direct contact with electricity or plumbing. You can use a cell or cordless phone.

Do not wash your hands, bathe, shower, do laundry, or wash dishes.

Get Ahead of the Winter Freeze

It's not too early to begin preparing for the heating season. Check these 10 tips off your list and get ahead of the winter freeze.

	Our furnace has been inspected and serviced by a qualified professional during the last 12 months. (A furnace should be serviced at least once a year.)
	Our chimneys and vents have been cleaned and inspected by a qualified professional. I have checked for creosote build-up. (Not cleaning your chimney is the leading cause of chimney fires from built up creosote. This service needs to be done at least once a year.)
	Our wood for our fireplace or wood stove is dry, seasoned wood .
	Our fireplace screen is metal or heat-tempered glass , in good condition and secure in its position in front of the fireplace.
	We have a covered metal container ready to use to dispose cooled ashes. (The ash container should be kept at least 10 feet from the home and any nearby buildings.)
	Our children know to stay at least 3 feet away from the fireplace, wood/pellet stove, oil stove or other space heaters.
	Our portable space heaters have an automatic shut-off.
	Our portable space heaters will be plugged directly into an outlet (not an extension cord) and placed at least three feet from anything that can burn; like bedding, paper, walls, and even people. (Place notes throughout your home to remind you to turn-off portable heaters when you leave a room or go to bed.)
	We have tested our smoke alarms and made sure they are working. (You need a smoke alarm on every level of the home, inside each bedroom and outside each sleeping area. For the best protection, the smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.)
	We have tested our carbon monoxide alarms and made sure they are working. (Carbon monoxide alarms should be located outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.)


