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From the Board of Supervisors...

As we approach Spring, we are pleased to announce our 2023 capital projects program. To assemble this capital projects budget, we solicited input from both our professional staff, residents, and our 5-year capital improvements plan. This year's focus is on Township parks and infrastructure projects. Below is a list of the prominent projects you can expect this year.

- 2023 Township Road Program (Roads to be repaved) – 2.61 Miles of Road!

 - ◆ Replacement of existing Mobile Data Terminal laptops in Police patrol vehicles with tablets

 - ◆ Replacement of gutters, downspouts, and window casings on the Municipal Building
 - ◆ Replacement of original VCT tile flooring in the Municipal Building with durable, long lasting plank flooring
 - ◆ Police Department renovations necessary to acquire Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation
 - ◆ Replacement of roof and gutters on the Public Works Building

“That won’t happen to me...” – The Importance of Interconnected Smoke Detectors

“I’m very careful. I’ve lived here for 35 years and never had a problem. Why do I need to upgrade and add more smoke detectors now that I am moving?” I have heard this or similar comments frequently as I am performing the Use and Occupancy inspection in some of the homes in the Township. This is required by ordinance when anyone sells a home or business, or changes tenants in a rental property here within Warwick Township. One aspect of the ordinance addresses the need for smoke detectors throughout the home.

The code for smoke detectors in Warwick Township reads as follows:

“All new and existing structures, buildings, or dwelling units shall contain a properly maintained and functioning smoke detector present on each level, in each bedroom, in the basement and each basement room separated by a door. A heat detector or smoke detector shall be in the garage. The smoke detection system shall meet the requirements of the applicable Township building codes. When actuated, the audible alarm of the smoke detection system shall meet the requirements of the applicable Township building codes referencing decibel levels for smoke detection systems. All detectors shall be interconnected so that when one detector senses smoke or heat, all devices activate simultaneously. All smoke detectors must have a battery back-up feature. Detectors in new construction must be hardwired. In existing units, detectors may be hardwired, wireless or a combination of both types.”

This mandates the smoke detectors to be in compliance with the code otherwise they must be upgraded to meet the requirements for the added safety it brings to the home and its occupants. A recent event brings to light the reason we have this condition. A few weeks ago, a couple who had purchased a home in town last year had



a fire in their garage. At the time of the sale of the home, the Use and Occupancy inspection was performed. Only the 3 original 35-year-old smoke detectors were in the home. To comply with the requirements of the inspection, the smoke detectors were replaced, and wireless interconnected detectors were installed in all the necessary locations throughout the house, including the garage. This detector sensed the smoke as the fire was small, alerting

the residents to the frightening situation growing in the home. 911 was called and because of the quick response and actions of the firefighters, the damage was limited to the garage with only smoke damage to the rest of the home. Although they will need to be out of the house for a short time while repairs are made and cleanup is completed, they will be able to return home soon. Had the smoke detectors not been upgraded at the time the home was sold, this might have been a much different story including significant damage to the home or a complete loss, and the possibility of the residents being injured or perhaps killed.

The Use and Occupancy process worked, and very well in this instance. But you don’t have to wait until you sell your home to upgrade your smoke detectors and add an extra measure of safety to your home. The Township offers a home safety inspection for a nominal fee to help you determine what items need to be addressed to make your house as safe as possible, because when you think “that won’t happen to me,” it really could.



Fixit Bike Repair Station Added to Community Park

Have you ever been enjoying a day on your bike, riding the trails of Warwick Township when suddenly you get a flat, break a spoke or pop a chain? Not only is your relaxing ride around the scenic township ruined, but now you have work to do.

Presenting the latest addition to Warwick Community Park: The Fixit bicycle repair station by Dero. This handy repair station was installed between the playground and the large pavilion. The Fixit includes the most common tools to perform simple repairs and maintenance on the go. Philips and flat head screw drivers, six sizes of Allen wrenches, a headset wrench, a pedal wrench, four sizes of box wrenches and two tire levers, make any repair manageable. Hanging the bike from the hanger arms allows the pedals and wheels to spin freely while making adjustments. The attached bike pump is right there to keep your tires topped off and ready to roll. Best part is, the Fixit repair station can even give you directions on how to fix your bike! Located on the side panel is a QR code that will take you right to their website and step by step instruction for basic repairs.



The Fixit bike repair station is an exciting addition to our trail system. Check in out this spring while you're out for a ride.

Know Your Local Wildlife – Planting Native

As we enter Spring, landscaping and gardens become a priority for many. It is extremely beneficial to pollinators and other wildlife if native plants are used. This is because natives are the most valuable resource to successfully support a variety of species. Native means the plant was established in an area prior to European colonization.

Native plants are very well adapted to the area's conditions and generally require little maintenance. We are fortunate enough to have establishments in Bucks County that specialize in native plants for sale. Be aware big box stores and other retailers may claim their plants are native, but they are not, it is best to do your research prior to purchasing native species. A few natives for reference are Buttonbush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*), Bee-balm (*Monarda didyma*), and Oak trees (*Quercus* sp.). 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License Your Dog in PA

All dogs three months or older must be licensed by Jan. 1 of each year. Violators can be cited with a maximum fine of \$300 per violation plus court costs.

An annual license is \$8.50 and a lifetime license is \$51.50. If the animal is spayed or neutered, the annual fee is \$6.50 and lifetime is \$31.50. Discounts are available to older adults and people with disabilities.

The small license fee helps the millions of dogs in the state by funding the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement.

Dog licenses are available from your local county treasurer and other licensing agents.

Reasons for dog licensing:

- It's the law. All dogs three months and older must have a current license.

- If your dog gets lost, a license is the best way to get him back. A license helps animal control and shelters identify your dog and get him back home safely.
- The cost of a license is less than the penalty for being caught without one. Owners who fail to license their dogs could face a fine of up to \$300 for each unlicensed dog.
- License fees support animal control. The annual fee you pay to license your dog helps keep shelters running and supports the work of the Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, which is responsible for ensuring the welfare of dogs, regulating dangerous dogs and overseeing annual licensing and rabies vaccinations.



FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR

MOVING ON TO 2023!

2023 County Township Real Estate tax bills will be mailed by March 1st. The discount due date is April 30th or June 30th with no discount. Central Bucks School Real Estate tax bills are mailed by July 1st. They are due at discount by August 31st or October 31st with no discount. There is also an installment option. Three payments due by August, September and October. There is no discount for installments. Please call the tax office if you do not receive your tax bill or have questions. Properties with assessment changes will receive a notice from the Bucks County Board of Assessment. Interim bills will then be mailed. New homeowners or a property with a deed change last year, please remember to apply for the Homestead credit.

You may receive a notice from the Bucks County Board of Assessment. This form is due to them by March 1st for 2023.

ALL RESIDENTS PLEASE REMEMBER WE HAVE A 1% EARNED INCOME TAX. You must file an annual return with Keystone Collections by April 15th. This office collects only real estate taxes. Top Ten Yard Tips to Protect Our Streams

1. Water your lawn no more than 1 inch per week. Use a rain gauge to keep track.
2. For the healthiest lawn possible, set your mower to its highest setting.
3. Reduce your fertilizer use, and use organic, slow-release fertilizers.
4. Choose native plants from the nursery to reduce maintenance and increase the habitat value of your yard.
5. Capture rain from your roof with a rain barrel. Use the captured rain to water your lawn and flower garden.
6. Choose alternatives to harmful pesticides like beneficial insects or non-toxic chemicals.
7. Compost your yard and kitchen waste. Use the compost as an excellent fertilizer for your lawn and gardens.
8. Remove invasive plants growing wild in your yard, and refrain from purchasing invasives from nurseries.
9. Test your soil so you can identify and address problems.
10. Reduce the size of your lawn to save money and time on maintenance

PAVILION RENTAL FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

(updated 11/22/22)

Starting January 1, 2023, ALL pavilion rentals will be completed on-line at the Parks and Recreation website at www.warwickrec.com.

How do I find out if a date is available?

You can go to www.warwickrec.com. Hover over "Facilities" and click on "Calendar". Once at the calendar, choose your location from the drop-down menu and check the month you are looking for. There is a limit of 2 rentals PER DAY.

Where are the forms to reserve a pavilion?

There are no longer any forms needed for private pavilion rentals. Everything will be completed on-line at the Parks and Recreation website at www.warwickrec.com. Forms will still be used for GROUP rentals which include day cares, schools, summer camps, church groups, etc.

What do I need to do to finalize a pavilion rental?

Follow the instructions on the website to make your reservation and pay for your permit.

What is the cost to rent a pavilion?

The fee is \$40 per hour for residents of Warwick Township and \$60 per hour for non-residents. There is no longer a security deposit required for rentals.

If I rent a pavilion, is my rental the only group allowed to use the pavilion?

Although you have a permit, the parks are all public facilities, and you are responsible for self-policing the pavilion during your scheduled rental. **MAKE SURE YOU BRING A COPY OF THE PERMIT THE DAY OF THE RENTAL.**

What pavilions can be rented?

Community Park has two pavilions. The Large pavilion is near the playground. The Small pavilion is near the hockey rink. Both pavilions have electric available. Bathrooms on-site.

Memorial Park has one pavilion. The pavilion has electric available. Bathrooms on-site.

Hampton Chase Park has one pavilion. No electric. Port a pot.

Guinea Lane Park has one pavilion. No electric. Port a pot.

What are the capacities of each pavilion?

Community Park Large Pavilion – 75 people

Community Park Small Pavilion – 60 people

Memorial Park Pavilion – 60 people

Hampton Chase Park Pavilion – 25 people

Guinea Lane Park Pavilion – 25 people

Is there a time limit for rentals?

There is no limit to how long you can rent a pavilion. Rental times start at 9am and end at 9pm. Each rental receives a ½ hour buffer for set-up and clean-up. This buffer is built in to avoid bottlenecks between rentals. There is a limit of 2 rentals PER DAY.

What happens if it rains the day of my rental?

The first option is to try and re-schedule with you for a different date. If we cannot reschedule, you will be issued a full refund for the rental at the discretion of the Director of Parks and Recreation.

Is there a group rental policy?

Yes, there is a group rental policy. Due to the enormous popularity of the parks and the large number of requests from various organizations to bring groups to the park, the Township has implemented designated group days, times and use guidelines. For further information, please speak directly to the Parks and Recreation Department.

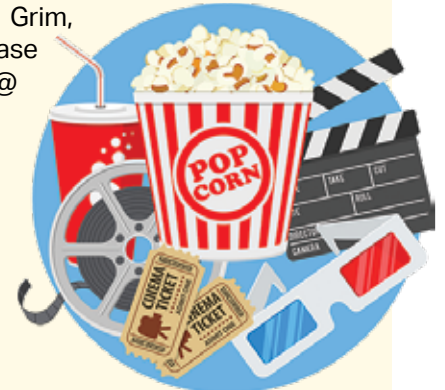
Warwick Township Movies in the Park 2023
