IISTORICAL INFORMATION

WARWICK TOWNSHIP



MOLAND HOUSE

Warwick Township was officially organized in 1733. With a little imagination, you can picture the traffic on York Road in those days-stagecoaches and horse-drawn carts. Quite different from today's traffic!

Did you know that George Washington's army of 11,000 men camped here in August 1777? Local legend says that the Stars and Stripes were unfurled before American Troops for the first time during the encampment.

Washington headquartered for two weeks at the Moland House, which lies on the original York Road, one half mile north of Bristol Road. The Warwick Township Historical Society cares for the 18th century farmhouse.

Other historical structures in Warwick Township include the Neshaminy Warwick Presbyterian Church and the Eight Arch Stone Bridge built in 1804.

COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: How is trash handled in Warwick Township?

A: Trash is handled privately in our Township. Residents must independently contract with a hauler for trash services.

Q: Does the Township host e-waste and paper shredding events?

A: Yes, the Township alternates yearly between e-waste and paper shredding events. Please visit Warwickrec.com for more information.

Q: How do I dispose of paint or other hazardous materials?

A: The Township does not host hazardous waste disposal events. For more information on how to dispose of these materials, please contact the County at 215–345–3400.

Q: Does the Township collect batteries, lightbulbs, and ink cartridges for recycling?

A: Yes, collection containers can be found in the lobby of the Township Administration Building.

Q: Where do I dispose of my yard waste?

A: Township residents can drop off yard waste at Warwick Grinders - Sparks Topsoil. Please see page 13 for more information.

Q: How do I rent a pavilion?

A: To rent a pavilion, please submit the Pavilion Rental Form found on our website along with the required payment.

Q: How much does a permit cost?

A: We require a \$50.00 permit deposit along with your application. That deposit is then put toward your remaining balance. Please refer to our Fee Schedule for more details.

Q: Do you accept credit card payments for fees?

A: Yes, we accept Visa or MasterCard. Please note that there is a 3% fee for credit card payments.

Q: Do you have a Dropbox at the Township?

A: Yes, the Dropbox is located by the main entrance of the Administration Building.

Q: How do I get a plot plan of my property?

A: Please reach out to our Administration Office and provide them with your property address.

Q: Does your Township require Deed Registrations?

A: Yes, please see the Deed Registration Form on our website.

WHEN IS A PERMIT NEEDED

Permits are required for, but not limited to, all additions, basement finishes, sheds, decks, fireplaces, chimneys, pools, fences, dormers, window or door enlargements, re-roofing, electrical or plumbing, heating, venting, or air conditioning system installation or replacement. More information on what projects require permits can be found on our website at warwick-bucks.com/permitsforms/.

The Township also requires occupancy inspections prior to each new owner or tenant for residential, commercial and industrial uses. Please contact Robert Prato, Fire Inspector/Code Enforcement at 215-343-6100.

If you have any questions about contemplated construction, a proposed use or occupancy change, please contact Thomas Jones, Zoning Officer at 215-343-6100.

PERMITS are NOT required to replace exterior siding, windows, or doors when replaced in-kind.

Why do we need permits?

- 1. Permits allow the Township to ensure all structures are safe and meet regulations. Your building plans are reviewed by certified inspectors, knowledgeable in building, plumbing and mechanical codes. Electrical requires third-party review and approval. They also inspect your project at several points throughout the project. This ensures that your structure meets the current Building Codes, as adopted by the Township.
- 2. During zoning review, our staff ensures that you are meeting all requirements for setbacks, the distances from your boundary lines. We also ensure your project doesn't obstruct the flow of stormwater (such as through a swale); encroach on any Township right-of-way; or obstruct the view of traffic along our roadways.

Permit Fees

Permit fees vary by project. A flat fee may be used, or the fee may be calculated by the cost of the project, square footage, and/or number of fixtures.

CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION

All residential new construction. commercial contractors, and sub-contractors are required to register with the Township Administrative Office. Contractors must supply the Township with a current certificate of insurance.





PLANNING & ZONING DEPARTMENT

It is ILLEGAL to:

- permit your dog to stray at-large.
- burn without a permit.
- store abandoned or junk motor vehicles on your property.
- make structural alterations to your home without a building permit, and zoning permit where applicable.
- let weeds or grass grow over six (6) inches high.
- fail to erect a fence around any swimming pool. The fence MUST be non-climbable, a minimum of four (4') feet high, and have a self-closing, self-latching gate.
- have a residential, commercial, or industrial building without an easy-to-read street number.
- perform or contract electric, plumbing or, HVAC, work without a permit.
- obstruct any waterway in any manner at any time.
- park more than one commercial vehicle (9,000 lbs. limit) on a residential property. The vehicle must be a primary means of transportation.
- cause or permit growth of vegetation, open shrubs, or trees which obstruct vehicular vision.

SNOW REMOVAL

Warwick Township Ordinance #2014-02 requires the clearing of sidewalks within 36 hours of snowfall, sleet or freezing rain. Failure to comply will result in the issuance of a warning, further failure to comply will result in a fine.

WARWICK TOWNSHIP PARK SYSTEM









The Parks and Recreation Board, a five (5) member advisory board, is made up of residents who volunteer their time and expertise to advise the Parks and Recreation Department on policy and special events.

Dan Sharapan, the Parks and Recreation Director, can be reached at dsharapan@warwickbucks.gov. Dan oversees the daily operation of the department including programs & facilities.

Kristen Belles, the Program Coordinator, can be reached at kbelles@warwicbucks.gov. Kristen is responsible for the programming of all recreation programs and camps for the Township. If you ever have a new idea, want to see something offered, or would like to volunteer, please contact Kristen.

Below is a description of the Warwick Township Parks System:

WARWICK COMMUNITY PARK, located at the Township Building just off Meyer Way is 27 acres. Amenities include a large pavilion with restrooms, a small pavilion (electric is available at both pavilions), an in-line skating rink, multi-purpose fields, two (2) lit basketball courts, a 1.5-mile blacktop multi-use path, the Recreation Station Playground, and the ever-popular spray pole. Spray pole hours are 10am to 7pm, seven days a week, typically Memorial Day to Labor Day.

GUINEA LANE PARK, located at 2045 Guinea Lane, is 36.86 acres. Amenities include a tot-lot playground, a basketball court, six (6) pickleball courts, one (1) tennis courts, six (6) baseball fields, a whiffle ball field, a small pond, and a small pavilion with electric.

HAMPTON CHASE PARK, located at the corner of Dark Hollow Road and Almshouse Roads, is 20 acres. Amenities include two (2) softball fields, a multipurpose field, a small pavilion, a tot lot playground, a small pond, and a walking path.

JAMISON HUNT, located on W. Rockspray Drive, is 12.28 acres. Amenities include a tot-lot playground, three (3) tennis courts, and a basketball court.

HIDDEN POND, located on Long Pond Drive, is 10 acres. Amenities include a tot-lot playground, a basketball court, a baseball field and a small pond.

MEMORIAL PARK, located at 1200 Memorial Drive, is 50 acres. Amenities include Safety Town, a large playground, a pavilion with restrooms, and nearly 1.5 miles of blacktop path.

Voting Districts:

District #1 — Warwick Township, 1st Floor (1733 Township Greene), for those who live South of Turkey trot Road and West of York Road.

District #2 — St. Cyril Catholic Church (1410 Almshouse Road), for those who live South of Almshouse Road and East of York Road.

District #3 — Warwick Township Fire Company (2390 York Road), for those who live North of Almshouse Road, West of York Road, West of Mill Road and South of School Road (Includes Mill Ridge, Deer Run, Eagle Court, Tripp Avenue and Adams Way).

District #4 — Warwick Township, 2nd Floor (1733 Township Greene), for those who live South of Almshouse Road, North of Turkey Trot Road and West of York Road.

Sparks Topsoil, located at 2616 Rushland Road, is a great place to drop off yard waste. All containers (bags, cans, etc.) must be emptied upon arrival.

What they accept (3 yard max):

- Leaves - Tree and tree limbs (3" diameter or less)

- Brush - Christmas trees (must be untrimmed)

- Shrubs - Small stumps and logs under 6' in length

They do not accept trash, stumps, grass clippings, pressure treated wood, railroad ties, bamboo, telephone poles, cinder blocks, rock, metals of any kind, tires, concrete, or any material that cannot be made into mulch.

The yard waste is composted into double ground mulch, free to Warwick Township residents with proof of residency. Black, brown and red dyed mulch, as well as a natural triple ground mulch is available for sale. Since May 2021, Warwick Township has dedicated collection containers for hard-to-recycle everyday items. Located in the rear of the Township Administration Building Lobby, residents are invited to deposit their residential batteries, incandescent light bulbs, and ink/toner cartridges free of charge.
