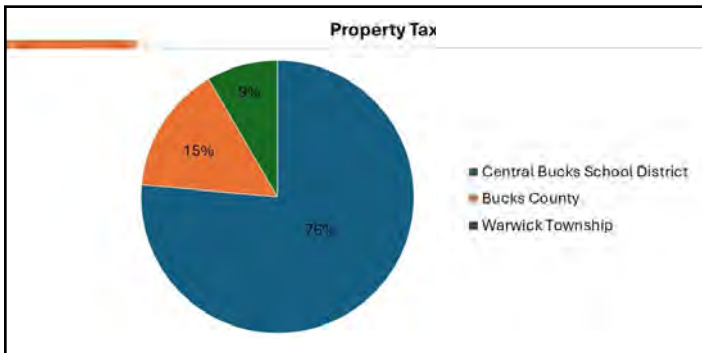

From the Board of Supervisors . . .

What services do you receive for your municipal taxes? Real estate tax bills include three separate entities (municipal, county and school district). The municipal and county taxes are printed on the same bill. The municipal (Warwick Township) portion of the tax bill is a fraction of the overall real estate tax bill. The average Warwick Township residential property pays \$612 per year for local government services.



Those contributions fund the following local government operations for the Warwick community and our capital improvements. The 2025 capital projects were highlighted in the Spring edition of our newsletter which can be found here: warwick-bucks.com/newsletter-archive/. Details associated with Warwick's six (6) major operational areas are provided below.

Finance/Administration Departments

- Preparation and administration of an annual balanced budget
- Long-term financial and capital improvements planning
- Preparation for various audits and adherence to standard government accounting principles
- Ensure public bidding/prevaling wage requirements are met for all applicable projects and purchases
- Acquisition and administration of over \$4M in grant funding since 2018
- Preparation of monthly bill payments and treasurer's reports
- Human resource management of 50 Township employees
- Negotiation and administration of all Township contracts and agreements
- Drafting of Township ordinances, ordinance amendments, and resolutions

Planning and Zoning Department

- Processing and review of all land development, conditional use, and zoning hearing board applications
 - Administration and inspection of approved developments
- Processing and review of all zoning, grading and building permits, use & occupancy applications, and registrations
- Conducting of annual fire safety inspections for all Warwick businesses
- Investigation and enforcement of all code violation complaints (zoning, stormwater, property maintenance, local ordinances)
- Performance of floodplain management

- Warwick is a class 7 member of FEMA's Community Rating System which grants Warwick residents a 15% discount on their flood insurance

- Registration and inspection of all on-lot septic systems and cellular facilities

Parks and Recreation Department

- Maintenance of all Township parks, fields, courts, playgrounds, restrooms, trails, and spray pole
 - Including Community Park, Memorial Park, Hampton Chase Park, Jamison Hunt Park, Hidden Pond Park, Guinea Lane Park, Moland House Historic Park, Warwick Green Park, Lee Drive Park, and Pollinator Park
- Plan for and replace playground equipment and park facilities as needed
- Maintenance of 1,000+ acres of Township owned open space
 - Grass cutting, dead/diseased tree removal, and tree planting
- Acquisition and administration of all conservation easements
- Administration of the annual sidewalk/trail program
 - Including expansion of new sidewalks/trails or repaving of existing Township trails
- Program and sports offerings for all age groups
 - Visit warwickrec.com for program and registration details
- Organizing and managing numerous annual and bi-annual events
 - Including shredding, e-recycling, Ho Ho Holiday, Egg Hunt, Pack the Police Car, Movies in the Park, Halloween Happening, and the flea market
- Coordination of the use of our facilities, fields and courts with all approved sports organizations and clubs

Public Works Department

- Coordination of the annual road program
 - Township roads to be repaved or reconstructed each year
- Maintenance of 60 miles of Township roads, including bridges, road and street signs, line striping, and street sweeping
- Maintenance of all Township-owned stormwater management facilities
 - Including inlets, culverts, and basins
- Coordination of streetlight repairs and replacement
- Coordination of traffic light repairs and timing adjustments
- Conduct snow and ice removal, and salting operations on of all Township-owned roads
- Conduct post-storm cleanups
 - Including removal of tree debris, restoring road washouts, erecting sign knock downs, etc.)
- Management and maintenance of the Public Works fleet and construction equipment
- Maintenance of all Township facilities

Police Department/Emergency Management & Services

- 24/7 police services
 - Accident investigations
 - Criminal investigations
 - Traffic enforcement
 - Community outreach and discarded drug drop off
 - Youth Aid Panel and Community Accountability Program participating agency
 - Bucks Police Assisting in Recovery (BPAIR) participating agency
 - Emergency management and planning
- 24/7 emergency medical services (advanced and basic life support)
 - Township owned EMS building located centrally in Warwick to ensure reduced response times

Warwick Township Fire Company

- 24/7 all-volunteer fire services
 - Respond to all fire calls (house, brush), smoke and CO2 alarms calls, and vehicle accidents

- Perform traffic control
- Community outreach with annual events

The Warwick Township Board of Supervisors has remained committed to providing these services and more without increasing property taxes since 2010 or issuing bonds to accrue debt. Notwithstanding, the Township remains in a strong financial position.

Drive Smart: School Zones and Buses Are Back



With the start of the new school year, we can expect extra traffic, pedestrians, and bicyclists throughout the community. In some cases, extra patience may be needed on our roads. The Warwick Township Police Department would like to remind everyone to please be careful as our children are walking, biking, or riding the bus to and from school. Please pay attention to the 15 mph school zones and obey the limit! In the interest of keeping our children safe, the Warwick PD strictly enforces school zone speed limits.

Last school year, Central Bucks School District buses were equipped with surveillance cameras. Photos of vehicles driving past school bus stop lights are provided to our police department for evaluation. If we verify a violation, a \$300 fine is mailed to the owner of the vehicle. Unfortunately, about 135 notices were mailed to vehicle owners last school year for violations in Warwick Township. This program is designed to increase safety for our children – not to levy fines. When you approach a school bus with the yellow or red lights activated, please keep the following in mind to avoid a fine, or even worse, a needless tragedy:

- When the school bus yellow lights are activated, be prepared to stop. This is not an opportunity to get past the bus before the red lights come on. Last year, many motorists were seen racing past school buses as stop arms and warning lights turned red.
- Unless the road is physically divided by a barrier, opposing traffic must stop. That means ALL lanes on York Road must stop for a school bus picking up or discharging passengers.
- Be patient – some students require extra time and adult assistance to get on or off the bus. If the red lights are activated, you cannot drive past.

Fall is a busy season with back-to-school and fall festivities! Come September, many parents will be sending their kids off to college, some for the first time and others returning. It is important to educate students on the importance of fire safety! Here is a fire safety checklist for students:

- ☐ Ensure the smoke alarms are working properly
- ☐ Use flameless candles
- ☐ Know and practice your fire escape plan
- ☐ Determine a safe place to meet outside in case of a fire
- ☐ Be sure hallways, stairs, and exits are clear
- ☐ Clean the dryer lint trap before and after each use
- ☐ Turn off all appliances when they are not in use
- ☐ Be power safe! Do not overload extension cords or power strips

FACT

! Fires in dormitories are more common during the evening hours, between 4 p.m. and midnight, and on weekends.

! Roughly eight out of ten fires in dormitories are started by cooking equipment.



- ! When choosing a costume, stay away from long trailing fabric and be sure masks have eye holes large enough for your child to see out.
- ! Provide your child with a flashlight to carry or glow sticks.
- ! Keep all decorations away from open flames and heat sources.
- ! Remember to keep exits clear of decorations

Greetings from the Tax Office

HAPPY FALL FROM THE TAX OFFICE

Real Estate tax bills for 2025 were mailed March 1st and before July 1st. School taxes are due at a discount by August 31st or full payment by October 31st. If you did not pay the County Township tax bill, they are in penalty now. Liens for unpaid County Township Tax bills for 2025 will be turned over to Bucks County Tax Claim by December 31st. Liens for unpaid school bills will be turned over to Portnoff Law Associates via the Central Bucks School District by December 31st.

Please update the tax office of any address changes. New homeowners or deed changes, please remember to apply for the Homestead reduction through Bucks County Board of Assessment by March 1, 2026.

The tax office has a generic e-mail reminder list of mailings and due dates. If you would like to be included, please send an email to Denise - subject e-mail list and you will be added.

To contact Denise at the Tax office call 215-491-0611 or e-mail Warwicktaxbetts@aol.com. This office collects only real estate taxes. The earned and LST tax Collector is Keystone Collections. You can contact them at 1-888-328-0565 or their website at Keystonecollects.com. File your local return with Keystone by April 15th every year.

KNOW YOUR LOCAL WILDLIFE

Birdhouse Cleaning 101

Did you know birdhouses should be cleaned between breeding seasons?! Just as we prefer clean and hygienic housing, so do birds. Dirty birdhouses allow harmful parasites and bacteria to succeed which can make birds sick or even result in death. In addition, these conditions can attract flies and rodents which are harmful to the eggs and chicks. It is up to the birdhouse keeper to ensure there is not a passageway for our feathered friends to get sick. The best time to clean birdhouses is once the breeding season has ended, you may need to do additional research to figure out when that is for a particular species, but generally September is a good month. In addition, it should be noted that bird feeders and baths should be cleaned regularly as well.

Follow these steps to ensure a happy healthy birdhouse (source birdfeederhub.com):

- 1. Prepare:** Gather gloves, a mask, a scrub brush, a bucket, and a cleaning solution (1 part bleach to 9 parts water or a natural alternative like vinegar). Choose a well-ventilated area for cleaning.
- 2. Empty the Box:** Open the birdhouse if it has a removable panel. Remove all nesting material and discard it far away from the birdhouse to prevent attracting pests or predators.
- 3. Scrub Thoroughly:** Use the cleaning solution and a scrub brush to remove dirt, debris, and any residues inside the birdhouse.
- 4. Rinse Well:** Rinse the birdhouse with clean water to ensure no cleaning solution remains, as it could harm birds.
- 5. Dry Completely:** Allow the birdhouse to air dry fully in the sun before reassembling or placing it back outside. A damp birdhouse can encourage mold and bacteria growth.

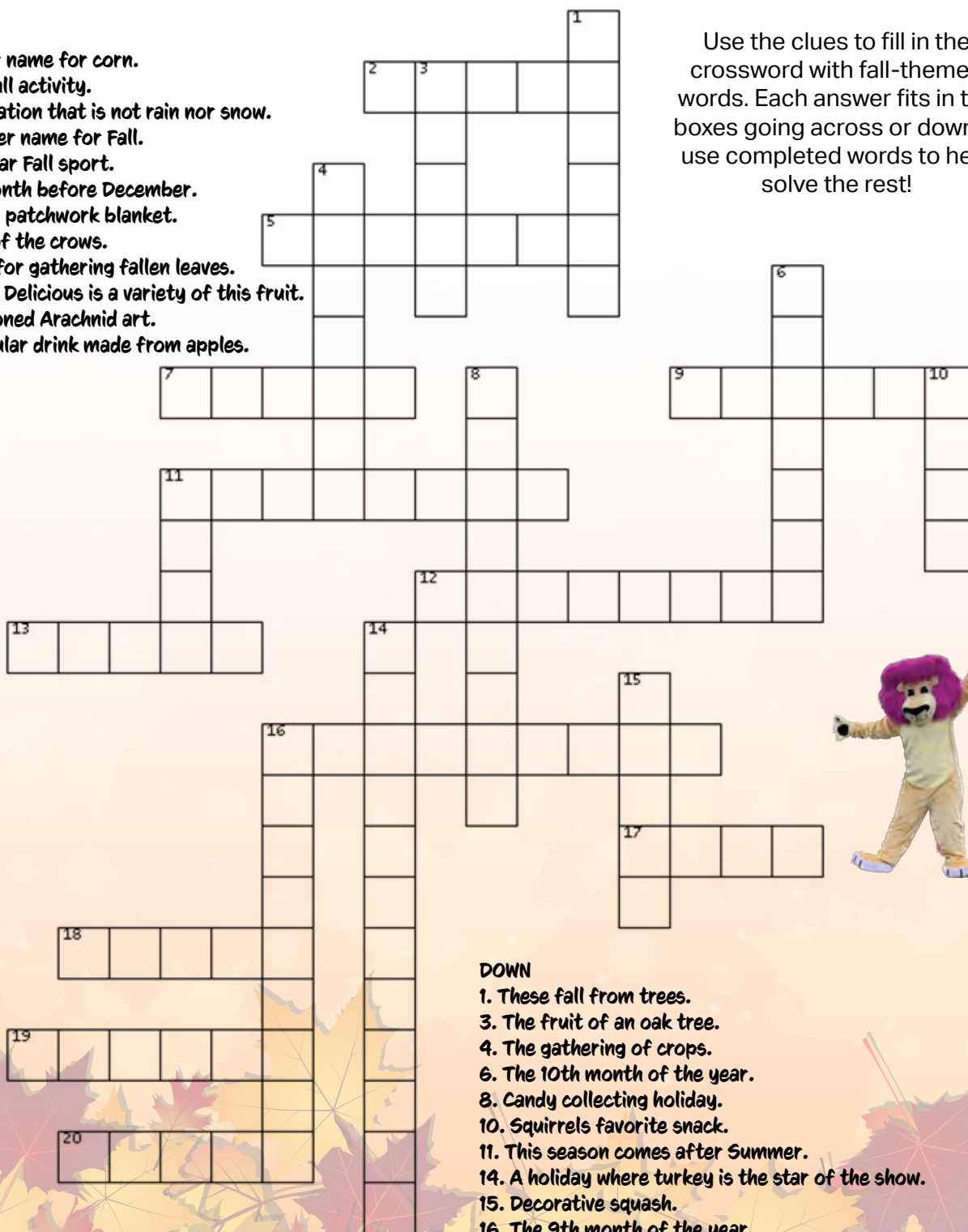

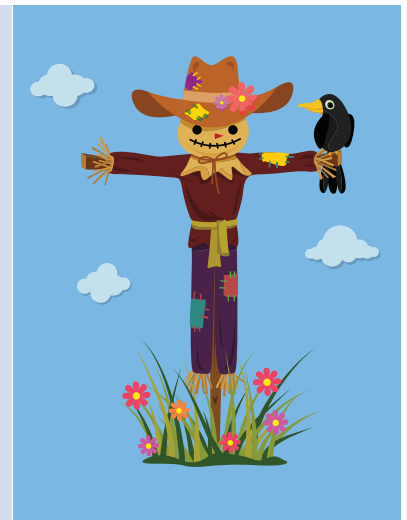
